# WORSHIP TEAM COVENANT (Volunteer Copy)

#### **Purpose Statement**

Our worship team exists to bring glory to God, as well as encourage the body of Christ. Our aim is to praise and worship God, not just when we are together, but with our lives so that "the words of our mouth and the meditations of our heart" are acceptable to the Lord (Psalm 19:14). Our goal is to glorify and acknowledge the Lord's presence and strive to bring the church into that realization, through many styles of music. We strive to prepare the church for the preaching of the Word of God. In addition to the reading and signing of this covenant, a personal testimony and questionnaire will be submitted to the Worship Pastor for review.

#### **Guideline Statement**

As a worship team member our lives should proclaim our worship to God and reflect that we are growing in our relationship with Christ. Our *daily* actions, words and attitudes should reflect that maturing relationship; in a church service as well as outside of the church building. The following guidelines are requirements in order to be a participant of the First Christian Church worship team:

#### Christian.

Participants must be born again believers of Christ and follow Him. As stated before, our lives should reflect our maturing relationship with Christ. We do not "put on" an act for Sunday and then "go back" to being a different person the rest of the week. A participant of the worship team should be a leader and make wise choices in their lives, "in church and out of church."

#### Attendance.

Participants must be committed attendees at First Christian Church. Music ministry is not the right of the talented, but instead the privilege extended to the committed and faithful to the Lord as well as to our church body. Special music is sometimes an exception to the attendance guideline. Special music on occasion will be someone who is not a regular attendee. In that case it will be approved by the Worship Pastor or Pastor. Committed attendance examples are our prayers, regular church attendance, tithes/offerings, and support of the church leaders.

# WORSHIP TEAM COVENANT (Volunteer Copy)

#### Skills.

The musicians, vocalists, and technical support need to be skilled enough to follow a service which has been planned, practiced, and led by the Spirit of God. We don't want to limit what God will do simply because we are not all trained. As our church grows, the standard of musical abilities required may vary. Individual participants need to work at their instrumental and/or vocal ability to become the very best that we can be. Musicians and vocalists should have open hearts to receive advice, correction, training, and should be well tempered at that time.

## Team Effort.

The worship ministry here at First Christian Church is a team effort. We need to be able to "flow" as a team, not as individuals. We are a single unit with a single purpose. Our heart attitude should not be to show off our individual skills (no matter our background or musical abilities), but instead be to enhance the team as a whole and to bring glory to God.

#### Commitment.

The worship team requires a fairly large amount of time. In the event of multiple worship teams, each participant will be required to attend practice, and to be prepared on their designated weeks. Attendance and punctuality are important factors for being a participant of the worship team, reflecting self-discipline and a respect for the Lord's ministry. Notify the Worship Pastor in the event you are not able to make a practice or service. There is a no practice, no play policy. This is to ensure that what we practice as a team will be implemented the same way at a service. Each participant will be required to attend our quarterly potluck. The potluck is not only for the fellowship and unity of our team, but it is also to set schedules, pray as a group, and to share what the Lord has been doing.

# Dress Code and Other Etiquette.

Proper dress is important in this ministry. We do not desire to call attention to ourselves or to offend others. Our dress should be glorifying to God as well as acceptable to the human eye considering this is an "up front" ministry. There should never be any open container beverages brought onto the stage or near any equipment. Practice is to be carried out during practice time. This means that when practice is over and it is almost time for the service to begin there should be no person playing an instrument or singing into the microphone. The exception is the introduction music to the service.

# WORSHIP TEAM COVENANT (Volunteer Copy)

#### **Probation Period.**

There will be a 2 month probationary period in which the individual will attend practices as well as a church service each week. During this period the individual will not play/sing in services. The purpose for this probation period is to understand the individual's commitment level to the church and team, as well as their commitment to glorify God. This period also allows time for the individual to "mesh" with the team and get to know the songs sung on a regular basis. At the end of the probation period it will be up to the Worship Pastor's discretion to have the individual begin participating in regular services.

#### Communication.

There needs to be open communication. Whether it is through phone, e-mail, texting or in person the Worship Pastor must be notified of your absence. There is a time and place for everything and in the event someone's feelings are hurt, arguing back is unacceptable in front of a group. A better decision would be to talk about the matter private as to not distract others' worship experience or practice time. We need to remember that "the words of our mouth and the meditations of our heart" should be acceptable to the Lord. If they are acceptable to the Lord, they are acceptable to others.
