Judah's Last Days of Freedom, 609 BC

- The King of Egypt Kills Josiah in Battle (2 Ki 23:28-30a; 2 Chr 35:20-27)
- Pharaoh Neco Replaces Jehoahaz with Jehoiakim (2 Ki 23:30b-35; 2 Chr 36:1-4, cf. Jer 22:10-12)
- Jehoiakim Begins to Reign (2 Ki 23:36-37; 2 Chr 36:5)
- Jeremiah's Temple Sermon and Subsequent Persecution (Jer 7:1-8:3; 26:1-24)
- Jeremiah's Prophecies Against Judah (Jer 8:4-20:18)

The Coming Exile and the Babylonian Threat

- Additional Victims of Babylon (2 Ki 25:18-21; Jer 52:24-27)
