Have you ever been on a nice sandy beach watching the waves roll in and out? And did you notice how quickly those waves erase any footprints that were in the sand? I am always amazed when I see that. Amazed at how quickly the signs that someone just walked on the beach are swept away, not to be seen again.

It always makes me think about the many days throughout the years that my family and I went to the beach, dug great big holes in the sand and made great big castles, only to have them vanish by the time we went back the next day. Gone, nothing, not even any sign that we were there.

How the days seem to have gone by just like that also. One day I am playing on the beach with my daughters as 4 and 5 year olds, and the next day they are college aged. Where did the time go? And, maybe more importantly, what did I do with that time?

What do we do with our time? And how do we leave any sign that we have been there? The apostle Paul spent his last days in prison. He knew that his time was short. He knew that there were not too many more days ahead. How did he use his time? What did he do with the time he had left? He wrote to Timothy and to Titus. He wrote to the churches. He wrote about Christ and he spoke about Christ. For Paul, the best use of his time was promoting and proclaiming Christ. He knew that the waves of time were close to erasing his footprints from the sand so he wanted to leave something that would never be erased by time – the gospel of salvation.

He said these words in his letter to the Philippians, "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain" (1:21). Paul knew that the only sign of his life that he could leave for others was Jesus. What are we spending our time on?
