The Visitor

Dear Friends,

We are in the midst of the 50 days of Easter! We get to celebrate Christs resurrection for 50 days. Within that time frame we have Christs Ascension and then the Day of Pentecost. Historically the season of Lent was set aside as a preparation for baptism. At Easter, the water flows freely. At the Easter Vigil, during the second half of the service, new members are added to the congregation and the candidates for baptism are baptized. At Atonement we might not have a vigil, but we still give thanks for the gift of Baptism each Sunday in worship at the beginning of the service. This replaces our normal rite of Confession and Forgiveness. While it might seem strange to some, as Martin Luther put it, baptism and the confession are tied together.

Martin Luther reminded us that each morning when get got up and washed our face we were to remember our Baptism. Over the course of his life, Martin Luther suffered great bouts of anxiety and depression. He would have crises of faith so severe that he doubted his own salvation. At times he became so frightened he had visions of Satan standing before him, ready to usher him through the gates of hell. So, he placed a large plaque in his room that said: "Remember your baptism." Luther understood that the fact of his baptism was much stronger than any doubt or anxiety he might produce. It is said that Martin, because his bouts with depression were so severe, would repeat as a mantra: "I am baptized! I am baptized!"

The thanksgiving for baptism recalls some significant scriptural images of water- creation and flood, exodus and baptism of Jesus. It also gives us voice to the power of water to sustain life and how water is connected to the word in baptism that renews all of God's people.

In this way, it reinforces Luther's understanding of the continuing character of baptism and its presence in all of life for people of faith.

Finally, the language of thanksgiving for baptism does what contemporary Christians do so little in lives apart from worship: It shares a model of praise and adoration to the triune God. Our habits of prayer so often lack anything other than intercession—asking God for things. So to have language of adoration and praise is a gift in and of itself and models such thanksgiving for the people of God to appropriate in their own lives of prayer and devotion.

So this season of Easter, Remember you baptism!

The Easter Season: Love Shows Up While the lectionary texts for the Easter season contain familiar elements from year to year (the Gospel of John, Thomas on Easter 2, at least one Sunday about shepherds/sheep), the readings aren't identical, and different themes emerge.

- Easter 2: John 20:19-31. The word love isn't used in this passage, but God's love shows up in Jesus' particular concern and care for Thomas and in bringing a breath of peace to the grieving disciples.
- Easter 3: John 21:1-19. "When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' He said to him, 'Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.'" Simon declares his love three times.
- Easter 4: John 10:22-30. Jesus knows the sheep, gives them eternal life, and promises that nothing will ever separate him from them.
- Easter 5: John 13:31-35. "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another."
- Easter 6: John 14:23-29 or John 5:1-9. "Jesus answered [Judas (not Iscariot)], 'Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them'." Or, from the alternate gospel reading, a story of God's love in action: Jesus healing at Siloam on the sabbath.
- Easter 7: John 17:20-26. "I made your name known to them, and I will make it known, so that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."
- Day of Pentecost: John 14:8-17 [25-27]. "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever."

Taken together, these texts ask and answer a series of powerful questions. How do we know God? Embodied love (Jesus). How can we be sure God is still with us, after the resurrection and before Christ comes again? God sends the Spirit. Because God loved us, we also can love.

Hymns this month...

Hymns have always held a special place throughout much of Christianity. Whether old or new, music has the power to transform our worship space. Like with all things, sometimes learning the historical background and scriptural references, deepens our connections and enhances our worship.

Blessed Assurance

"What does this melody say to you?" was a question asked of Fanny J. Crosby by her friend and composer, Phoebe Palmer Knapp. Her response, "Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine!" was just the beginning. She continued at that moment to recite the entire first stanza. In her lifetime she authored more than 8,000 gospel hymn texts, drawing inspiration from her own faith. Fanny J. Crosby was born in 1820 and declared blind at only six weeks old. It would be a hurdle she would quickly overcome, composing hymns beginning at age six. Blessed Assurance remains a hymn staple even 150 years after it was written.

River in Judea

On Sunday, May 26th, the choir will be singing a selection titled, "River in Judea," written by Linda Marcus & Jack Feldman. The song is in reference to the Jordan River and paints a musical land-scape of salvation and the joy that comes when we walk through life in the fullness and hope of Christ.
