#### **JUNE 2019**

First, let me thank you all for the prayers, cards, calls, and food. The surgery, I'm told, went well. The Doc removed the 7 screws and the metal straps that held my heel together after the accident 15 years ago. He removed all of the cartilage and tissue from the joint that connects the heel to the bone above it. He then took bone from my leg above my ankle and packed it in the joint above the heel to fuse that joint. Then he drove 2 screws to hold everything in place. I have a splint and elastic bandage from just below my knee past my toes. On June 4<sup>th</sup> the splint and stiches will be removed. A hard cast will be installed, and I will wear it for 4 to 6 weeks. A hard walking cast will be installed for another 6 weeks. In other words, I will be on crutches or the knee scooter until sometime in July. The hobbling around on 2 feet until just before Labor Day. I want to thank you all again for the prayers. I truly believe that your prayers made a difference. I have not had any major pain. On the 1 to 10 scale of pain with 1 being lowest, I was never at a 3 or higher. The surgery was on Thursday and by Monday I was totally pain free. Every once in a while, I still take a Tylenol, but not very often. Some of that had to do with the skills of the doctors and modern medicine. But I know a lot of people who still had major pain even with pain pumps and pills. I think a lot of the difference had to do with your prayers. Thanks again.

When you have to keep your foot higher than your heart there is not much you can do. Needless to say, I've watched a lot of movies. I seen Steve McQueen, Clint East-wood, Robert Duvall, and even got so far back in old westerns that I've watched Audie Murphey and Randolph Scott. I watched about every John Wayne movie from the time he was skinny until he quit making movies. I am not a "sit around" type of person. I'm usually active from the time I get up until shortly before bedtime. So needless to say, I am bored!!! Marty and Mary Jane had sympathy on Gale. They picked me up Sunday and drove me to church and back. I was able to tryout the back pew and get the view from back there. I haven't been in a back pew in many years. I had forgotten what it was like back there. The trip to church was the longest I had been out of the recliner. I enjoyed being out, but I enjoyed seeing everyone even more. I plan to be back on the chair up front on Sunday.

June has a lot coming up for our congregation. June  $2^{\text{rd}}$  is Ascension Sunday. On the  $3^{\text{rd}}$  the Illini 4000 will arrive for the evening. June  $9^{\text{th}}$  is Pentecost and we celebrate the birthday of the Church. Then, we will be again be having a Vacation Bible School from the  $23^{\text{rd}}$  to the  $27^{\text{th}}$ .

I'm glad to be back and active Sunday. Let's all join together in the month ahead to make these days special days of Worship, fellowship, outreach, and ministering to others. We are going to need people with hearts for the Lord and willing to serve Him by making the effort to reach out to others in this this special month.



#### May Administrative Council Meeting notes:

Parsonage—All of the restoration work is done, the claim is finished, and all bills are paid. There still needs to be a whole house cleaning. There are several maintenance items that need to be addressed. Council members will tour the home and compile a chore list of things to be done. The lists will be compiled and made available to the congregation. People can do any of the chores on their own time. We only ask they notify the office, Aaron, or the Pastor what they plan to do. A workday will be scheduled to completed unfinished items. A property manager had been selected and a contract will be drawn up soon.

Building and Grounds—Several from Council met with Architects for preliminary look at building. They will contact us within a couple of weeks with recommendations and costs. Architects did state that our towers are structurally sound. The north tower has a roof issue. Tuck pointing estimates came in along with stained glass maintenance prices. There is going to need to be a capital campaign and long-term plan to achieve what needs done with the building. It was decided this is more than the Council can do and still accomplish the regular business of the church. A Capital Campaign Committee will be formed that will drive this work and report to the Council. We also need a couple of volunteers to write grant requests.

The heat/ac units in the Chapel and office areas are going to be removed. They are no longer in use and are very drafty. The church is losing a lot of money due to the drafts through them. Volunteers will be requested to remove the units, then frame and insulate the openings. The insides will need drywalled.

The Chapel windows are to be replaced the first or second week of June. Midwest Windows will be doing the work. They have also been asked to replace the wood around the picture window at the top of the Fellowship Hall stairs and to finish out the exterior louvered area where the heat/ac units are being removed.

An adjuster will be at church on May 16th to look at the wind damage to the Sanctuary roof. A preliminary roof replacement estimate for insurance submittal was \$33,800.

An entry door alert needs installed so Kathy knows someone is in the building. Erney Lock and Safe gave a phone quote of \$650 Audible only and \$1300 for video. The Council is looking to other sources.

The janitor position is now open. The position will be advertised and refilled.

The wooden desk was moved from the Library to the Pastor's office. After a couple of weeks of sitting the desk was taken by a member of the congregation.

Audio-Visual—The microphone system is still under review. Due to changes in federal regulations it must be changed out by the end of the year. The correct size TV's and a multi-media mixer are being investigated.

Vacation Bible School—We will again have a VBS on June 23-27.
