

# PASTOR ROD'S MESSAGE



Since I always do something 'heavy', I felt as if some light-hearted humor might be fitting for our summer respite. **Please have fun reading these tongue-in-cheek** and don't go curmudgeon on me. There's at least a kernel of truth in each one of them.

"Have you noticed how many Bible translations are available these days? There are so many to choose from that it can get downright overwhelming. Lucky for you, we found some world-class Bible experts—fluent in the original Hebrew, Greek, and King's English—and they're going to explain the main differences between the most popular versions of the Holy Scriptures.

#### NIV

## PASTOR PHIL'S MESSAGE



The chaos of the defeat of the King before the Philistines caused the castle to go into panic mode (I Samuel 31). As the relatives of Saul fled with the threat of the incoming King's, David, attempt to secure the throne. The first use of the Greek word for Gospel (Good News) is when the Philistines defeated Saul and the Ark of the Covenant was taken hostage. The Greek Old Testament carries the idea of a herald spreading the news of conquer and victory. We see the herald as bad news for God's people. In the commotion of the upheaval a nurse carrying Jonathan's son Mephibosheth drops him causing him to be lame the rest of his life. But then David seeks Him out to fulfill His promise to Jonathan, his friend!

2 Samuel 9:7–8, 13 And David said to him, "Do not fear, for I will show you kindness for the sake of your father Jonathan, and I will restore to you all the land of Saul your father, and

you shall eat at my table always." And he paid homage and said, "What is your servant, that you should show regard for a dead dog such as I?" ... So Mephibosheth lived in Jerusalem, for he ate always at the king's table. Now he was lame in both his feet.

We see that David invites Mephibosheth to come and live at the palace not because of his own ability or what he had to offer but because he saw Jonathan in the face of Mephibosheth. We too do not come to the King's table because of what we did or what we have to offer but because the Father sees in us His Son, Jesus. We have a place at His table forever:

- 1. We are loved because of what Jesus has done. The Father brings us from enemy territory and poverty to nobility and His royal provision. He loves us like He loves Jesus!
- 2. Our inability and lameness does not rob us of God's provision. The lameness in our lives is hidden at the Kings table. The Gospel teaches us that in our weakness He is strong!
- 3. Our own inability may cause some to speak slanderously about our weaknesses. Let us find refuge and rest in King Jesus who takes us in and knows all our faults. He is faithful!
- 4. When we fall Jesus brings us up and stands for us! We cannot go to battle on our own. We see that even to the very end Jesus fights for us for our God is a warrior!

Stop striving to earn your salvation and instead rest this summer in Christ's finished work. We find that we are in need of coming away and finding rest in Jesus this season!



Many years ago my daughter ran from the parsonage to our car. My shout to not run in the parking lot came too late, as her little face hit a sharp edge on the bumper. Black ice! A quick trip to the ER, lots of prayers and a few stitches, and life went on. I learned I can't always protect my kids. I can't be with them all the time. Even when I am there, I may not be quick enough or strong enough to help them. I am not the super hero father I wish to be. # Health Ministry

## Want to Get Moving? Be SMART!

Are you interested in getting into shape! Think of the acronym S.M.A.R.T.

**S** stands for **Specific** – be specific when making activity goals. What, where, when, how? Change your thinking from, "I'm going to get into shape" to "I'm getting into shape starting tomorrow by walking at the park in the morning with Sally." Make your goals as specific as possible.

**M** stands for **Measurable** – How will you measure your goal? You could commit to walking 10 minutes 3 times a week, adding one minute each time. Wearable technology that measures your steps, time, heart rate, etc., is becoming more affordable and is a wonderful way to stay informed and motivated while you measure your progress.

A stand for Accountable—Try using a buddy system. For example, have Sally call or text to remind you the night before you walk. It's much harder to roll over and hit snooze when it's just you to think about. If Sally is waiting outside for you to show, you are much more likely to get moving. If you don't have a real person who is free to exercise with you, consider joining an activity group...real or virtual! These groups are gaining in popularity through social media and can be very motivating as well.

R stands for Realistic – is your goal realistic? If you never ran a 10K but want to try to next week, you're setting yourself up for failure. Match your active goal with your current lifestyle, state of health and realistic abilities. It's much better to walk a few minutes a day and increase that as you go than try to run a 10K, hurt yourself, and set yourself back emotionally and physically. Having a strong desire to get into shape and gain better health can motivate you into a realistic mod-of-action! Also, just because a friend got in shape by doing something that worked for them doesn't mean it's the best option for you. You are more likely to stick to something that works for YOU and that you like it. There's plenty of ways to move and groove! Select different options and pick the ones that may work for you that you like and fit in your current lifestyle. Seeking a professional, certified health and fitness coach may help you decide what's best and realistic for you. Of course, consulting with a healthcare provider before you begin is always wise.

**T** stands for **Time** – set a timeframe to reach your goal. Avoid saying "Someday I'll do this or that." Someday is not a timeframe: it's wishful thinking without a plan. Instead, try something like, "I will walk 30 minutes a day in intervals of 10 minutes per day for one month then reassess my goal." Much better! And, you may adjust your timeframe accordingly along the way.

T can also stand for **Type** – What type of activity interests you? Being part of a team sport? Working out alone, with a group? Something non-competitive? You may not want to ride a stationary bike if you sit all day at a desk – that's a lot of sitting, and you may desire to walk instead, be it more throughout your day at work or outside during your lunch break. Even standing at your desk can help. If your job is very intellectually challenging and stressful, mindful activities like yoga, Tai Chi may be for you.

Be "**SMART**" when setting activity, health or any goals. You are much more likely to achieve them and by doing so, you will feel more confident, competent and ready to set another goal!

# Book of the Month

Safely Home by Randy Alcorn

This is a fiction book, but it could very well be a non-fiction missionary book. What happens in this story I'm sure is happening in China today.

Two friends who had gone to college together. Li Quan was from China, had mysteriously gotten a full scholarship to Harvard, met Ben Fielding and they became roommates and friends. They were Christians. Li Quan determined to go back to China and share his faith however dangerous.

Ben's company wants him to go to China and knowing that they went to college together wants him to get together with him. Ben is not thrilled with this. He has not been in contact with Li Quan and it makes him uncomfortable knowing how Li Quan was so faithful to the Lord and he had not been.

From the jacket:

Is this the day? Li Quan's father had taught him from childhood to ask this question every day. He told young Quan. "One day the answer will be yes, and on that day you must be ready."

Quan stiffened at the shout behind him. The voice rang with the authority of the Gong An Ju., the Public Security Bureau. "You meet in the night like the criminals you are. How dare you defy the law? # My Most Important Freedom Is!

Freedom. What an important and wonderful thing to have. Our blessed birthright as an American citizen. Often times, freedom is taken for granted and that in and of itself is not necessarily a bad thing, until we as a people forget what we were freed from. This great nation was built on the idea that no power, neither foreign nor domestic would ever tyrannically rule over the American people again. So why have we prospered here in America, and what steps have we taken to protect the freedom we hold so close in our hearts?

The freedom of speech and the freedom to defend it are without a doubt the most important God-given rights that we have in America.
