

Introduction:

The Greek word *stratēgos* refers to civilian leaders (Acts 16:20, 22, 35, 38) or leaders in a military or guard setting (Luke 22:4, 52; Acts 4:1; 5:24). It speaks of one who both leads and governs a group or company of people. The plural, *stratēgoi*, then, refers to those who oversee and lead a group of people. Because of this, it is an ideal word to speak of leaders within a church or the training that equips them for their ministry.

More specifically, in the context of the Minden Evangelical Free Church, *Stratēgoi* stands for the training that prepares leaders for how to lead others in the congregation to fulfill our mission, to glorify God as joyful followers who know, grow to be like, serve, and share Jesus so that others can do the same.

Who Should Participate:

Anyone who is leading or wants to lead in the church is encouraged to participate. Special focus is on elders, Bible Fellowship leaders, deacons, deaconesses, and anyone who wants to disciple others.

How It Works:

To complete the *Stratēgoi* training, all eleven of the core studies must be completed + whatever extra curriculum applies.

At least five of the studies in the core curriculum must be completed meeting together in a *Stratēgoi* group. Any extra curriculum that applies must be completed in a *Stratēgoi* group. Other studies can be completed by the person reading them on their own (although it is recommended that studies be completed in discussion with at least one other person and/or with on-line helps).

Once all the studies have been completed a certificate and a special coin will be given to the person to acknowledge their hard work and achievement.
