LESSONS FROM THE 7 CHURCHES OF REVELATION: PERGAMUM & THYATIRA

(REVELATION 2:12-29)

I) The church at Pergamum (Rev 2:12-17)

- A) The City of Pergamum:
 - Was famous for its civilization and learning. Pergamum boasted a library center, a large, theater, pool, medical building, an agora, a palace, various temples, the striking remains of which may still be seen.
 - 2) Contained the first temple in Asia dedicated to a Roman Emperor, Augustus, in 29 b.c.
 - 3) Was home to the pagan cults of Zeus, Athena, and other false deities. The city possessed a commanding position on a hill high above the valley An altar of Zeus was situated in the acropolis. (The central citadel in a Greek city built atop the highest hill in the area) The large altar area may be that referred to by the Lord as "Satan's throne" (**Rev** 2:13).
- B) The church's Testimony (2:13).
 - 1) They honored the name of Jesus above all others.
 - 2) They refused to deny their faith even after a public example of persecution
- C) Their Failings (2:14-15).
 - 1) They began to embrace corrupting influences.
 - a) Baalam was a fallen prophet of God who was willing to compromise his faith and principles for personal gain (2 Pet 2:12-15; Num 22-25; 31).
 - b) Nicolaitans. Very little is known about them, but the Lord clearly "hated their deeds" (**Rev** 2:6).
- D) We must courageously maintain and demonstrate absolute loyalty to the Gospel of Jesus Christ (**Rom** 16:17-19).
- E) What They Needed To Do To Survive (2:16).
 - 1) Repent

II) The church at Thyatira (Rev 2:18-29).

- A) The City of Thyatira
 - Although never a magnificent city, Thyatira was the center of a number of trade guilds that used the natural resources of the area to make it a very profitable city.
 - These guilds were famous for dealing in dye's, metals and fine fabrics. Lydia, was a native of Thyatira (Acts 16:14-15). She probably was a member of a guild there that dealt in purple dye.
 - Guilds celebrated their patron deities in periodic festivals, so Christians may have been tempted toward the message of a "prophetess" who advocated participation in cult-based sexual immorality and food sacrificed to idols.
- B) The church's Testimony (2:19).
 - They were full of works of love, faith and service.
 - They also displayed faithful loyalty as they patiently endured.
 - They refused to be stagnant as they surpassed the works of the past and had excelled in their service for the Kingdom.
- C) Their Failings (2:20).
 - 1) They became indifferent towards false religions.
 - 2) They begin to sympathize and tolerate a false teacher.
 - Thyatira was facing the danger of redefining the Gospel message and the identity of *Lord's* church (Jude).
- D) What They Needed To Do To Survive (2:21-25).
 - 1) Repent
 - 2) Hold fast until He comes
 - 3) Love Truth more than

societal norms (1 Cor 10:13-22).
