

Dear Friends,

Although officially we are still in the fall season, it is looking more like winter. Liturgically, the readings in November start to look a bit more end times. We hear from Luke and his understanding of the beginning and the end of things. We also have the opportunity to think about our life together under the cross and in the empty tomb.

In reading Luther, you will see that he understood there to be two kinds of deaths. The little death and a big death. He explained: The big death is what occurs in the waters of baptism when the sinful self and the power of sin, death, and the devil are drowned; they no longer have the last word or ultimate power over us. The little death, for Luther, is the physical death, when there is no more breath in our bodies or life in our limbs. This death tends to be the one that engenders fear, the one in which tears are shed for what is lost, for what will no longer be.

We begin November with All Saints and Jesus declares "blessed" all those whom society would not consider blessed. While some may disagree with how Luke's gospel describes blessing and woe, it is good to remember that Jesus is not taking up politics nor is he up for election as an earthly ruler. Rather, Jesus' teaching comes from the perspective of a cross and a resurrection. Once Jesus emerges from the tomb, things can never again be the way they once were.

All of these texts are getting us ready for Advent and the new liturgical year. This year, on Christ the King Sunday, the final Sunday of the Church year, we will have a special service that will review the full year liturgically and help us put things into a broader understanding of the big picture. I hope that all of you will enjoy the service as much as we have in creating it.
