#### LIFE IS HAPPENING FAST

Did you hear the story about the snail who was beaten up by two turtles? His friends were looking for revenge, so they asked him: "Did you get a good look at the turtles who did this to you?" The snail answered, "No. It happened so fast." Life is happening fast, isn't it? The clock is ticking, time is flying, and every moment we live it gets later than it's ever been before. An unknown sage succinctly summed up the swiftness of life by stating, "The 7 Ages of Man are spills, drills, thrills, bills, ills, pills, and wills."
