#### A Note from the Pastor September 2019

September is a month when the temperatures begin to go down and activities go up. The month begins with school recently started and activities kicking into full gear.

Labor Day gives us a chance to take pride in honoring and remembering all of those who have worked so hard to make this country great. The men and women who have gotten up and gone to work each day to make their lives and this country better have often gone unnoticed and unappreciated. The 40-hour work week, vacations, lunch breaks, job safety, holidays, and other benefits have often been driven by the working people of the country. Like so many other things, we need to remember the accomplishments of those who have gone before us that make our lives what they are today.

Activities within the church are picking up also. Once again, we are leading the Buddy Bag program. Along with help from 2 other churches, we will be filling sacks on Thursday with food for children who otherwise would not have for the weekend. Those sacks are placed in the backpacks of the needy children by the elementary school teachers on Friday. This requires drivers to pick up the food, packers on Thursday evening, and a person to deliver the food to the school along with someone to pick up the empty bags. Cub Scouts start up again in September. We Charter a Pack with 4 Dens that meet in the church. Children from 1st to 5th grade participate in the Cub Scout pack and fill our basement on Tuesday evenings. If you are interested in being a Cub Scout Leader/Volunteer, please contact the Pastor.

Girl Scouts are again a part of our church. It is a small group that organized a few months ago. We are excited about these girls being in the building and are eager to see them grow and flourish within our building. The hygiene closet is starting at the school. This is a way to provide basic items needed for personal hygiene to our high school students. Many of you have donated items already and I thank you for those gifts. A list of items can be picked up in the office. More details for this will be provided in the next few days at church.

Celebrate Recovery is continuing, but numbers always pick up after Labor Day. This is a Christ centered recovery program for people with "hurts, hang-ups, and habits" of any kind, not just drugs and alcohol. Since I have been here, I have seen hearts given to Jesus that resulted in families reunited, habits kicked, children's lives made better because of the changes in parents, and people able to hold jobs again.

And of course, this is the month we start the preparations for the Covered Bridge Festival. Getting plans together, solicitating volunteers, gathering item for the sale, planning for the soup dinner, and such have begun and are picking up speed.




