A Note from the Pastor November 2019

It doesn't seem like it should be November. It also doesn't seem like it has been a year since I started as your Pastor. Time flies when your having fun! I hope you have been having fun. I have enjoyed the past 12 months.

November is a time that we think of the blessings the Lord has bestowed upon us. We start with All Saints Day. Originally celebrated on the 1^a day of the month it is now the first Sunday. It is the Memorial Day for all of Christianity. It is a time we remember all those who have kept the faith and passed on that faith of Jesus to us. Sunday we will honor those who we have lost this past year. We will also remember all the faithful who started the first Methodist congregation in Rockville that met on the Southwest corner of the Courthouse lawn in 1822 as well as each generation that faithfully gathered to continue meeting as people called Methodist. We are thankful for the Lay Leaders, Trustees, and other officers. Mostly, we are thankful for the Sunday School teachers, youth leaders, VBS workers and all the others who prepared the next generation to take over when they received their reward in heaven. Our thankfulness should also remind us of our responsibility to the generation that will take over for us when we are gone.

The next Sunday we will celebrate all those who have served our country. Although some consider November 10 to be a holiday (ask Aaron about it) we will honor the veterans in our midst on that day. From the Continental Army formed in 1775 to this moment as you read this note we have men and women who are willing to give their lives so we can live in the greatest country on earth. Each person who puts on a uniform knows the time may arise that will require they give up an arm, a leg, or their very life. Yet they put on the uniform and take that chance so we can live lives of peace and comfort. Because of our veterans we can gather at church, we can travel freely, we can join with our children & grand-children, we can speak freely, we can worship openly, and we can enjoy the liberty we often take for granted. Most of us will never know what our veterans have seen and endured in their service. They give their lives, their limbs, their sanity, and other parts of their being that we will never understand. For that we should always be thankful. When out with my children, or now with my grandchildren I have them go to the soldiers in uniform, and some veterans with their hats, shirts, and vests, and tell them thank you!

Thank God for our food and comfort, for our families and friend, for our church, and for His life in our lives. We are truly blessed. Thanksgiving should also cause you to think about how important is your walk with Christ. What are you willing to do to worship Christ and protect your children, grandchildren, other family and friends from the sin of this world?

I want to end this note in the way I started it. Sharing my thankfulness for all of you! As most of you know I served Eugene and Newport for 34 years. During the first meeting I had with the Ad Council I was asked why after 34 years why did I decide to leave and possibly come to Rockville? I told the Council that I was satisfied where I was serving. However, I had always prayed that when God decided the right place at the right time came for us, then I would get a call. In August of 2018 I received that call from the Asst. District Superintendent saying they had a spot for me to consider. I was excited when I received the call for the following reason. I did not tell the Ad Council the August call was not the first call. In June there was a windstorm at our house. We lost 22 trees. While cleaning up the trees by the front of the property our neighbor (who was your janitor at that time) came over and was telling us that the church was without a pastor. There was something inside me that let me know I was going to Rockville 1^a. The only thing I can't figure out is why it took the District Superintendent 2 months to figure it out I. I am thankful to all of you for accepting me as your pastor. For welcoming Gale and understanding her situation at Eugene. For the love you show us both we are truly and greatly thankful!!
