IS LIFE JUST ONE BIG ADVENTEROUS <u>RAMBLE</u>?

One could suppose that life is, in many ways, a ramble. The word seems to reflect an unplanned adventure full of unexpected moments of joy, satisfaction, gratitude, sadness, anger and frustration. It suggests that everything we perceive and experience is just a part of our life's ramble. Everything about our existence indicates that things have been put together in a rambling sort of way; a little bit here, a little bit there. Did the person who put it all together have a tidy or a rambling mind, or indeed did anyone actually put it together?

Our dictionary tells us that to ramble is to wander, hither and thither. Perhaps it is our inherent sense of curiosity that persuades us to wander? Why be curious? Why can't we leave well alone? Curiosity after all kills more than just cats! Would it be that our rambling is as a result of living in a very haphazard world; a world of chance, accident; an afterthought or even an act of spontaneity? It is undoubtedly an erratic and unpredictable world, a place of disorder and yet may it not be a place of organised disorder? For a kettle to boil, a picture of total turbulence, millions of atoms have to cooperate. Is our rambling therefore part of our organised disorder, our life's turbulence where everybody's turbulence forces us to ramble but in a cooperative fashion? The beauty and wonder of our environment: the colours, the smells, the tastes and above all the power of life; is it all one big bychance ramble or an act of purpose, of intent to help us find the source of WHY we are here? WHO we are?

As Christians we are reminded by Jean-Pierre De Caussde, SJ 'That God sends us along paths that he has chosen but which we cannot see; no amount of study will help.....Divine action is always new and fresh, it never retraces its steps, but always finds new routes.' So there we have it, God is the ultimate rambler!! Finally, within all of this there is a "constant", we need each other! We would not be what we are to each other unless we were able to ramble, to wander, hither and thither. May you all have a wonderful 'Hithering' and 'Thithering' 2020.
