PASTORAL MESSAGE

for the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time 26th January 2020 SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In his recent letter *Aperuit illis*, Pope Francis has designated today as **The Sunday of the Word of God**. This day takes on a particular significance for us this year here in England & Wales, as we reflect very particularly on the theme: "The God Who Speaks."

The Scriptures are, of course, central to our lives. Our reading and reflection on the inspired texts of Old and New Testaments enable us to encounter the God Who is love; Who sustains His people on their pilgrim way; Who is always faithful to us even when we go our own way; Who calls us back to Him and Who sends His Son, the Word made flesh, to dwell amongst us, to suffer and die for us and enable us to find new life through His resurrection. It is in the Scriptures that we read the account of the early Church as those who first responded to Jesus' call, through their encounter with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, began the Mission that we continue today.

The practice of Lectio Divina has been spreading in the Diocese in recent years and renewed copies of the leaflet outlining this way of prayer are available in parishes today. Join me in your encounter with the Word Who is Life through this way of prayer.

During this year, we shall have particular opportunities to join with our brothers and sisters in England & Wales in our celebration of "The God Who Speaks", notably at the Corpus Christi Celebration at Arundel Cathedral and – most especially for our school communities – at the Good Shepherd Celebration and the Secondary Schools' Pilgrimage to Arundel.

May we all deepen our experience of God's love for us as we read the Scriptures and hear them proclaimed in our Liturgy, that we may be formed by the Word for the Mission to which we are called.

'A DAY WITH MARY' This day of instruction, devotion and intercession, based on the message given at Fatima in 1917, takes place at Arundel Cathedral on **Saturday, 15th February,** starting at 10 a m with a

procession and Mass at $10\ 30\ a$ m celebrated by Canon David Parmiter.

THE WORLD (FORMERLY WOMEN'S) DAY OF PRAYER, will be held on Friday, 6th March. This year's theme is "Rise! Take Your Mat and Walk". The service has been prepared by Christian women of Zimbabwe and encourages us to reflect on the difficulties and unrest that has plagued their country for several years. As we participate in the service we are part of a great wave of prayer encircling the globe which begins as the sun rises over Samoa and ends some 36 hours later back in the Pacific as the sun sets over American Samoa; we will be joining with 130 countries and islands around the world. Richard and Hillary Grey have kindly offered to host this service of prayer in their Barn at The Old Farm House, Elstead. We are inviting all the Churches in Godalming and District to participate in this event. The service, which starts at 2 p m, will be followed by refreshments. There is ample parking so do put this date in your diary!

The origins of World Day of Prayer date back to the 19th century when Christian women in the USA and Canada initiated a variety of co-operative activities in support of women's involvement in mission, at home and abroad. It is from such roots as these that WDP has taken its present shape — a worldwide ecumenical movement of Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action.

It was not until the reforms of the second Vatican Council that Roman Catholic women were able to take a full part in the day of prayer and in 1967 the day was celebrated at a special service in Westminster Cathedral, by invitation of Cardinal Heenan. In 1969 the World Union of Catholic Women's Organisations encouraged Roman Catholic women worldwide to participate in WDP and to make this possible WUCWO moved their own day of prayer from March to May.
