A Note from the Pastor January 2020

Well, the good news is that I didn't have to buy an exercise bike for Gale's Christmas present. It seems Christmas came and went in a hurry this year and now it is the time for a new year to begin. What is in store for us in 2020 is a mystery to be revealed as the days go by. I am sure there will be blessings and disappointments, but more than anything I know God will be with us as a church and as individuals.

2019 was a good year for us. But it had its times of loss as well. We lost many loved and cherished saints of the church. People whom we can credit for the church we have today. Their efforts, work, and attitudes helped to keep the church and its ministries alive so we could continue in their stead. We mourn their loss, but we celebrate their lives and witness.

2019 was also a time in which we realized that we have some major issues with our building. The bricks need a lot of work (\$80,000), the stained-glass windows need maintenance (\$30,000), and the roof needs replaced (\$30,000). There are also a lot of minor issues to be corrected as well. You folks have stepped up as we have begun fundraising. We have also raised about \$1000 from people outside our town due to the GoFundMe page and the TV coverage. The capital project fund is \$28,176 toward the \$200,000 to \$250,000 to complete all tasks. We received a grant for \$2500 toward the architect's report. Two major grants for repair work are still being reviewed. No matter how much we receive, there is a continuing need for congregational effort. We need participation in donations, fundraisers, and grant efforts to accomplish our goals.

2019 has also been a time of blessings. We have grown as a family of faith. Reaching out to one another, caring for each other, praying for everyone, and joining in joyful worship.

We have started new programs and ministries. We have a Bible Study group that meets weekly. There is a children's Sunday School. We had a membership class in 2019. For the first time in several years, we had a Vacation Bible School.

2019 saw an increase in ministries. A bus ministry is now providing transportation for those who may not have a way to get around. The hygiene closets in Parke Heritage Jr and Sr High are providing personal hygiene items for kids who need them. Our clothes closet is clothing men, women, and especially children as well as providing coats and shoes.

The best part about these programs and ministries is the fact they all came from folks in the pews. They were not thought up and driven by the Pastor or Ad Council, they came about because the Holy Spirit stirred up the heart of someone. Those people answered the Spirit's call and started the ministry and programs.

In 2020 we will have gains and losses, blessings and challenges, joys and concerns. Through it all God will be with us, for us, and in us. I can hardly wait to see what God is going to do for us and through us in 2020!

HELD AT THE ROCKVILLE FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH



problem solve some of today's current issues that communities face.








