REFLECTION

Saturday, 8th February is a special day of prayer for 'The Victims of Trafficking'. What must be one of the greatest scourges of modern times and crimes against humanity is the number of children, men and women who are, as you read this, being trafficked into slavery. On our very own British shores people are being held against their will. It is by no accident that, also on 8th February, we remember St Josephine Bakhita.

Josephine Bakhita was born in Sudan in 1869. Bakhita was not the name she received at birth; it was given to her when she was kidnapped and sold into slavery in Khartoum. From there she was sold to an Italian family who took her to Italy. After some years she was entrusted to the Canossian Sisters in Venice. It was



there that she came to know about God, whom "she had experienced in her heart without knowing who he was" since she was a child. "Seeing the sun, the moon and the stars, I said to myself: who could be the Master of these beautiful things? And I felt a great desire to see him, to know him and to pay him homage." After several months with the Sisters she became a Christian and was given a new name, "Josephine". In December 1896 Josephine Bakhita was consecrated forever to God and for the next 50 years she lived as a true witness to the love of God. Her humility, simplicity and constant smile won the hearts of everyone. Her sisters in the community esteemed her for her constant sweet nature, exquisite good, love the Lord, pray for those who do not know him. What a great grace it is to know God!" she said.

As she grew older, she experienced long, painful years of sickness. Mother Bakhita continued to witness to faith, goodness and Christian hope. To those who visited her and asked how she was, she would respond with a smile: "As the Master desires". During her agony, she relived the terrible days of her slavery and more than once begged the nurse who assisted her: "Please, loosen the chains...they are heavy!"

It was Blessed Mary who freed her from pain. Her last words were: "Our lady! Our Lady!" and her final smile testified to her encounter with the Lord's Mother. She died on 8th February 1947. The fame of her sanctity has spread to all the continents; she was beatified on 17th May 1992 and Canonized on 1st October 2000. May she pray for all those being held as slaves and for all those engaged in the fight to end all forms of slavery.
