All those ripples in the tank began with an initial burst of energy. The crucifixion of Jesus brought about the single most explosive burst of the energy of God's love for humanity the world will ever see, the ripple effect of which is still going on today. The energy of that ripple has been perpetuated by all those people, down through the centuries, who have worked to keep the knowledge of God and of his love alive in our world.

The prophets of the Old Testament are dead; the apostles are dead; the great saints whom we remember through the liturgical year are dead. In the absence of all those faithful who have gone before us, it falls to us to continue the task of exercising God's love in order that the ripple of God's love can be passed on from one generation to the next.

One day, we too will be dead, and we might ask ourselves, "What will my life have been about? What will my life have been worth? What have I contributed to this world?" Whatever we have done or do in life, whatever our circumstances have been or are, our life will have had particular value to God if we have been personally instrumental in keeping that ripple of his love moving down through time, ensuring that future generations will come to know the value of love and, therefore, of God.

CORONAVIRUS PRECAUTIONS The Diocese is not aware of any directive to alter liturgical practices in view of concerns about the coronavirus and advises that people involved in the preparation and administration of the Eucharist and those who provide pastoral visits to Parishioners in their homes should be mindful of the importance of good personal hygiene as a matter of routine.
