

ADVENTURE IN MISSIONS
HONDURAS
CHERISE AND NELVIN GARCIA

We are so excited to be able to write to you and share all the wonderful ways that God has been moving in El Cacao, Honduras! He has been so good to us personally and faithfully shown us that this mission we are on is primarily His mission. Throughout these past months, we have experienced the goodness of God to new depths as we celebrated achievements and as we faced adversities and brokenness. It is such good news for us that no matter the circumstances we can trust in the promises of Jesus!

In August we started school with our 93 pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, and grade one students. As we spend time with each student we are certain that God has brought these precious little minds to our school so that they could know Him and be trained to serve Him and others. One of our favourite memories from this past term was our Christmas celebration, "Jesus is the Promise". We hosted nearly 200 students and family members.

Our youth group has a core of 15 that gather together to study the Bible once a week and to worship together weekly. We have worked to develop meaningful relationships with these young people so that the community created with the Youth Group would extend beyond the time we are gathered together. For many of the youth in El Cacao who come from broken homes the friendships they have formed at youth group are the closest relationships they have. Over the past several years we have taken volunteers to the central park in El Cacao to pray for El Cacao and worship.

As we close our newsletter we would like to share with you some discouraging news and invite you to pray. In November, Vida school was broken into and several valuables stolen. The most disheartening part for us is that we believe that the break-in was orchestrated by an employee of the mission who we had been helping. We knew that God's protection had nothing to do with material items but spiritual protection of God's mission at the school. Knowing that God was more interested in our spiritual protection allowed us to let go of the material items stolen and focus on guarding our hearts from bitterness or weariness so that we could get right back to loving and reaching our students.
