**Adam Pajan** is Artist in Residence at Saint John's Episcopal Church. Dr. Pajan plays the organ for our Choral Evensong services and he is the director of the Schola Cantorum, a men's choir offering Gregorian Chant at our regular Sunday 5:30 p.m. service. He is a member of the organ faculty at the University of Oklahoma in Norman. He received his DMA in 2014 under John Schwandt at OU following studies at Furman University and Yale University, earning the BM and MM degrees under the tutelage of Charles Tompkins, Martin Jean, and Thomas Murray respectively. His performing career has taken him across the United States and to five tours of Germany, as well as tours to England and Switzerland. He has performed at conventions of the American Institute of Organbuilders, Organ Historical Society, and the American Guild of Organists.
