PASTOR ROD'S MESSAGE

We love Nature!

It can be the dead of Winter with the snow blowing and hanging heavy on the tree branches, or a beautiful calm Summer day with the sun tanning our skin, or the brisk wind of a Spring morning with crocuses popping out of the ground, or even a gorgeous Fall day with the red and gold leaves falling all around us, we love the world that the Lord has called us to care for during our brief stay on His Earth. (I feel a chorus of "This Is My Father's World" coming on.)

It is a joy and pleasure to be a resident of this planet, made just for us. (Read Psalm 8, Genesis, and others.) Like Adam we are still under the mandate to care for the Earth. (Genesis 1:26-) We are stewards of God's creation. It too is under the curse and suffers greatly the after effects of sin. (For the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself also will be set free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now. (Romans 8:20-22) We are stewards in care of it, to have compassion on it, if you will.

We are not to trash it, as Apollyon, the Destroyer would. But treat it as God would expect us to treat any gift He gives. In fact, the ominous passage in Revelation 11 reminds us that we will pay an infernal price for defiling or corrupting this world. (...the time *came* for the dead to be judged, and *the time* to give their reward to Thy bond-servants the prophets and to the saints and to those who fear Thy name, the small and the great, <u>and to destroy those who destroy the earth</u>. (Revelation 11:18) I don't want to be numbered among those that in a cavalier way simply abused our stewardship of this small part of the God's Sphere.

Yet in balance, this world is part of God's creation and to worship it makes it an idol. That's what they were doing in the Temple in Ezekiel 8:14. "...were sitting there weeping for Tammuz." The Tammuz was the 'god' of vegetation, sun, rain -life. We find them throughout the OT making sacrifices and offerings to this 'god'. It's not at all unlike what we see the Liberals doing every day in our government, in the classrooms and boardrooms of our country. One seminary (Union Theological) even brought plants into their chapel and had their students bow down and ask for forgiveness of the plants for what we've done to them. Greta Thunberg even challenged and chastised the whole world for the evil we're doing to 'mother nature' (Don't miss the irony of the atheists believing there is a 'mother creator' but not a "Father God"). See she believes that humans are simply "an animal species, among others". (Too bad she never went to Sunday School.)

How are we to deal with this? 1) It'd be world changing, if we were even half as evangelistic about sharing Jesus as the climate control people are about their beliefs.

2) We should do what we can to care for the world God gave us. Recycle, try not to be wasteful, Jesus reminds us that "He who is faithful in a very little thing is faithful also in much;... Luke 16:10

3) We should have no fear about what will happen to the world, we can read about how it will end in the Bible. God's NEVER wrong!

4) People get lost in fear, when they forget that we have a Sovereign God that controls the ultimate outcome of all things. Don't live in fear (Psalm 46).

Because we love God and His world, but we don't worship it,

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PASTOR PHIL'S MESSAGE

The Bible, a better Guide for life today!

Psalm 119:25 My soul clings to the dust; give me life according to your word!

I remember driving around New England and getting lost. It is easy to get lost when the roads are patterned after old Indian trails. So you would think you are going one direction and with subtle angles, you may find yourself going in the opposite direction.

Once after finishing a project at the Boston Campus, I was heading over to another part of the city to meet Pam and have some dinner. I tried to get there and kept ending up further away. My phone GPS wasn't helping much either as it kept "recalculating route" at the precise wrong moment. We ended up stopping a policeman and asking for help. He showed us the route we needed and were there in no time at all. We needed an authoritative guide to help us.

God's Word created the world and everything we see. Today we find people questioning the Bible not because it is untrue but because they don't want it to be true. The World doesn't like anything that gets in the way of their freedom to sin. What they see as freedom is slavery to false-gods. Some things that may be good but misprioritized or twisted. The Authority of God's Word brings true freedom to our lives. This is why worship is centered around the Word!

Going back to my analogy that getting lost is very easy especially in an old city with tunnels and roundabouts. Without a guide we end up someplace we don't want to be or is unsafe. What if you put your trust in the wrong things? When GPS's were initially created they were glitchy. I remember reading of one young lady driving her car right into a lake. The world's way is very much like that we drive our lives following the world's leading and end up in the wrong place, and without Christ, it will be a Lake of fire. Don't listen to the world's GPS! Put your faith and trust in Christ's life, death, & resurrection for salvation.

So how do you keep from ending up at the wrong destination? Sincerity and freedom won't save you, you need to have your relationship with God in place. We need to understand His voice and listen to His Word. We apply His Word by the power of the Holy Spirit. I know that we are all busy but here are a few suggestions to get more Bible into your everyday.

Load a Bible app on your phone. (Many are free and have an audio feature)

Wake up 15 minutes earlier every morning and read.

Ask God for help to understand before you read.

Look for ways to read during lunch or at other times.

Read the Bible with your Family after dinner for a few minutes.

Read while waiting for someone, like a doctor.

Ask God regularly to help you apply His Word!

Ezekiel 36:25–27 "I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules."

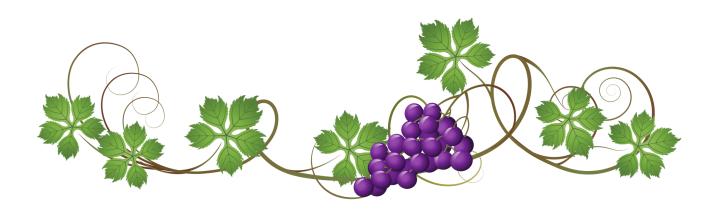

How do you feel when someone pays you a sincere compliment? Feels good, right? There is such positive power in giving sincere compliments.

When you give a nice compliment to someone, it provides a positive feeling for the recipient and you! You can feel grateful and experience a happy boost! We all need to feel appreciated. Giving compliments to coworkers, significant others, children, neighbors, and sometimes even strangers (when appropriate) spreads positivity both to the receiver and the giver. And, compliments boost brain power, too! It's scientifically proven that giving compliments and praise increases dopamine, a neurotransmitter produced by the brain. When dopamine is increased, it sends positive, uplifting messages to the brain that in turn helps us feel better, be more productive and can help us achieve our goals and dreams. Amazing, huh?

You never know how even a small compliment can make someone's day. The important thing is to be sincere, not fake. 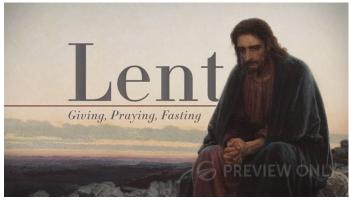
Why Do Christians Give Up Something for Lent?

Romans 5:17 says, "For if, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ." **Grace is a free gift through Jesus. You do not earn God's good favor.** The Bible also says that fasting should be done privately. Matthew 6:16-18 says, "And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you." Fasting is a spiritual discipline that is between you and God.

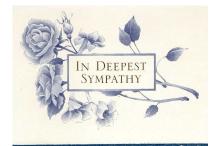
