"Set aside that which is full" were words spoken to the woman in 2 Kings 4:1-7. Her husband had died. The creditor would come to take her sons. She was instructed to fill empty vessels



with oil that was in a pot at her home. After being filled the vessels were to be set aside. They would then be sold to



satisfy her debt. Not only would her debt be paid but there would be sufficient funds for her and the sons to live. There would be more than enough to cancel the debt. Enough to sustain her and two sons would

come through vessels that were filled and set aside.

At Calvary Jesus did more than provide cancellation of our sin debt when he died. He rose triumphantly over death, hell and the grave. After returning to the Father, He sent the Holy Spirit to abide with us. John 14:16. He longs for us to have abundant life. More than being rescued from hell's flames is His desire for us. He longs to fill these earthly vessels with His Spirit and set us aside. His desire is for us to have life more abundantly. We can be a vessel so full of His Spirit that it spills over into the lives of others. It is the filling of the Holy Spirit that sets us aside making us witnesses that draw a lost and dying world to Him. Acts 1:8
