40 Days in the Wilderness

Upcoming Lenten Devotional

For hundreds of years, Christians, and those who were exploring Christianity, spent the days leading up to Easter as a time of intentional spiritual growth. This was typically done through prayer, repentance of sins, fasting, denial of ego, and sacrificial giving.

In most mainline churches this tradition was formalized on the church calendar as the Season of Lent. Starting on Ash Wednesday (February 26th this year) and ending the day before Easter, the 40 days (Sundays don't count) of Lent represent the 40 days after Jesus' baptism, that he spent in the wilderness fasting and being tempted by the devil.

Five years ago, I wrote a devotional book for adults who had been baptized so that they could have their own 40 day focus on scripture, prayer, and applying their new faith to their lives. As I was looking ahead to this Lenten season, it occurred to me that we should use my 40 Days in the Wilderness study as our focus this year.

I only have three copies of the book left (free to the first three people who request one) so the daily devotions will be delivered by email to everyone who wants to take part in this Lenten study.

The message for each Sunday in Lent come from my study of the devotions each week.

I was in one of the big hospitals in Houston today. As I sat in the waiting area, I saw a wide range of the human condition played out before my eyes.



There was an older couple (I don't know how old, but if you saw them you would say, "That's an old couple."), she had a walker and he was using a cane. They were talking with each other as they walked down the hall headed to her doctor's appointment. They were oblivious to everyone else walking past them or impatiently trying to get around them.

I saw a little boy (best guess would be around 2 years old) making a mad dash away from his frazzled father. It was obvious that the child had used up all the patience he had and was working hard on using up all of dad's as well. Mom was being pushed down the hall in a wheelchair with a mask over her face, holding a baby that couldn't be more than a couple of days old. You could tell she was tired but you could see the smile in her eyes as she watched the great race.

One lady was stopped in the middle of the lobby talking on her cell phone, crying. She was telling her mother that the tests came back negative for whatever disease they had been dreading. The joy and relief flowed out of her for all to see.

I saw a doctor walking away from a family with his head down as the chaplain was walking up to them. The shock on the faces of the family told the story of unanswered prayers and devastation.

There were so many stories going on in just that little place that I was overwhelmed with them all. I couldn't imagine how anyone could deal with all that was going on around me. It was then that I felt God speak in my heart. "I got this."

That was when I started seeing where God was in all the situations around me. In the love of two people with years of experience together. In the love of parent and child. In the healing that brought tears. In the pain of death. God's love was all over the place.

Whatever your situation, joyous or tragic, remember, God's got this.


