Text: II Corinthians 5:16-21

Title: Reconciled Relationship with God Secured by Jesus Christ

Introduction

Christ's death upon the cross was accomplished a sacrificial payment that we might be reconciled to God.

I. Why do men need such a reconciliation with God?
