

Wow, it is hard to believe we are already thinking February, the month of "LOVE" and Valentine's Day and candy and more snow and Super Bowl! As I was thinking about all that is before us as a church in this year 2020, I have been asking the Lord to give me personally and our church a

special kind of love to be the people and the place he desires. Last week, I came across this writing by Phil Ressler in my devotions. In my heart I knew this is what I was praying for so I want to share it with you.

"And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, so that you may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God." (Philippians 1:9–11, ESV)

These verses outline the purpose for which Philippians was written. In Paul's fondness for the people of this church, he wants even more for them. His prayer for them is that:

- 1. Their love may abound more and more.
- 2. They would grow in knowledge and discernment.
- 3. They would experience the fruit of righteousness.
- 4. It would all be for the glory and praise of God.

These are not prayer requests for the Philippians alone. They are prayer requests for us as well. We would do well to regularly pray these petitions. They are four benefits to pray for ourselves and for others. Breaking these requests down further:

## • To abound in love

We pray for more than gushy feelings. We pray that we would love by serving God and others in a more selfless way. We pray we would make commitments that are not self-centered, but other-centered! We pray that we would love better.

## • To grow in knowledge and discernment

We pray we would become more knowledgeable of the things and the ways of God. Reading the Scriptures! Studying the Scriptures! Memorizing the Scriptures! Teaching the Scriptures!

But we pray for more than knowledge. We pray for discernment. Another word for this is wisdom. I can be knowledgeable but not wise. Wisdom is the ability to use the knowledge we have to be able to do the right thing and make good choices. We pray we would live out our faith in ways that are wise.

## • That they would experience the fruit of righteousness

We pray to be free from worry and anxiety and that we would have peace in our hearts and joy in our souls. Even though life may be crazy, we pray that we would be content and confident in God.

## • That it would all be for the glory and praise of God

We pray that others would see Jesus in us and through us. We pray that heaven would be bigger because of the witness and the testimony that we gave. It's not to us, but to His name be the glory.

A few weeks ago, I shared a prayer vision the Lord put on my heart. I was encouraged to make it a part of my pastor's page this month. I share this with you as something I believe God wants to do in our lives both now and in the days ahead.

We thank God for His faithfulness to each one of us personally and our church family and community. We recognize that in these challenging times we live in, we must confess we cannot lead or carry out God's purpose for our lives on our own.

### **2020 PRAYER VISION**

When Jesus told us to "Go make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19) - He was telling us to go DEEP and to go WIDE. He wants us to reach everywhere and nation (that's wide) and to teach each other "everything he commanded" (that's deep.) So below are specific ways we can Go Deeper & Wider Together with a Prayer 2020 Vision.

## **Be Presence Prayer Goals:**

- 2. That we as a church family and community, would desire a deeper desire for God's Word and prayer and worship, sensing its importance and urgency in our lives, every day.

May we pray, fast and seek the Lord together praying to hear His voice above all others. To see His hand guide us by the power of the Holy spirit in unity and grace. In the midst of this journey, may we not lose our focus on our love and mission for Christ together.
- 4. More people experiencing Jesus' healing power in physical, mental, emotional, sexual, spiritual and relational break-throughs.
- 5. More one-on-one discipleship relationships (mentoring men, women and students.)

- 6. See intentional discipleship growth in the following areas: children and their families, youth and their families, building relationships with our young adult and adult community as well. This growth can spur from Life Groups, Sunday School, or any other way we can reach others for Christ, both inside and outside our walls
- 7. More Spirit-empowered boldness to share Jesus in our individual spheres of influence.
- Twenty or more people fully surrendering their lives to Christ as 8. Savior and Lord.
- 9. Serve the local surrounding community by meeting 2-3 more ongoing needs as the Lord leads.
- 10. Continue to pray, go, give generously and support financially all our mission opportunities and missionaries and continue to minister to Collingswood, Camden, Upper Darby, Ireland, Jamaica and Mexico, a new work and witness opportunity for our church in July.

May each of us take the opportunity to experience God's love so we might share it in the places and space in which we live.

## Decision 2020 <u>A Way Forward for FUMC Collingswood</u>

It is clear from the events following the General Conference of February 2019, including the votes taken at the 10/26/19 Greater NJ Annual Conference, that the discord within the United Methodist denomination is not settled – and perhaps has even increased. There are various proposals getting some attention for what may transpire at the 2020 General Conference as well, but there seems to be universal agreement on only one point: some type of split within the denomination is coming – <u>and local churches will have a decision to make regarding their future affiliation</u>.

We at FUMC Collingswood have been praying and patiently waiting for the denominational issues to become clear, and though there are still many unanswered questions, we can wait no longer. We must recognize that 2020 will be a year of decision about the future of our local church, and to make that decision as an entire church body, we must make sure that all members are informed of the issues and are best-prepared to take part in that decision when the time arrives.

To that end, below is a schedule of meeting dates that are open to all members of the church. There are multiple dates when the same information will be discussed, because not everyone is available at one specific time throughout the week. People may attend as many as they like, but all are strongly encouraged to attend at least one meeting on each discussion topic, so that everyone is informed to a reasonably consistent degree. Please mark your calendars.

<u>**Part I – Background Basics:**</u> What are the core issues causing the discord? What actually happened at General Conference in February 2019, and GNJAC in October 2019? How has FUMC been involved in discussions at the denominational level so far?






# Opportunities for Serving in 2020

## Don and Norma Toland, PA

As many of you know, from 1972 to 2001, we were privileged to work among the Rawa people in the mountainous region of the Madang Province in Papua New Guinea. These people are subsistence farmers whose livelihood is producing lush, yearround gardens in their beautiful rain forest setting there. In 1992 they received their translated Rawa New Testament.

For about four years now there have been gangs of anti-Christian Rawas, who have been attacking their people, destroying their gardens, pillaging their homes, killing people, and in some areas, burning entire villages to the ground. To date we've been unable to get any accurate reports as to whom is causing all this evil destruction.

Satan is having a field day trying to totally destroy the Rawa people. The Rawa people have been fleeing for their lives to other Rawa villages, to the Ramu Sugar Town at the foot of their mountain range or to the Rawa settlements in the distant towns of Madang and Lae. People who have remained in their home areas where this is occurring, are afraid to even venture out of their homes to tend to their gardens or to hike along their trails to participate in any village activity.

Since our end-of-the-year letter was written, we have received some further sad news about the Rawa situation and what's been happening. The village of Tauta where we lived and worked for so many years, has been pillaged and totally burned to the ground leaving only two homes one of which was our former village home in which the Rawa Literacy Coordinator, Yunu Siwi, had lived since 2001. Many of them have fled for fear of their lives to other villages, and have been further routed from there as well.

#### A BIG NEED FOR PRAYER

Please join us in asking the LORD to do battle for these Rawa people, and to raise up some strong Christians who will take a stand to defeat Satan, our arch enemy.

## Ken and Karen Pregizer, Yukon

Too close for comfort!

A few weeks ago, while driving to Anchorage for the twofold purpose of working in the SEND office and flying out to Idaho, we came very close to sliding off a remote part of the highway! In our 33 years of driving in winter/icy conditions, this experience was the most frightening of all. Without going into detail, suffice it to say that we both were convinced the van was beyond control and was heading off the highway. Our only explanation that we did not go over the edge is that God intervened and spared us from certain disaster. We know that many of you are praying for us and when we ask for safe travel, God knows

Just two weeks after our harrowing experience, friends, fellow workers and retired SEND missionaries, Don & Mille Ressler had a similar encounter on another stretch of the road while driving their van home to Glennallen. Three of the four occupants in the vehicle (including two nurses from California) escaped injury when the van flipped end-over-end into the ditch. However, Millie was medevac'd to Anchorage and was operated on a day later and is now recovering from lower back surgery. She is expected to recover fully but PT and time for healing is needed. Please pray for Millie as her body heals and is able to move around with the aid of a brace. The accident could have been much worse, and we see how God also intervened in sparing Millie's life, providing a cell signal where no signal normally exists, providing two UN-injured nurses on the scene and skilled doctors in Anchorage to operate, to name a few examples.

Our experience on the icy road last month again reminded us how fragile life can be. In an instant, we could be taken off the scene and ushered into God's presence. Although we look forward to the day when we will be reunited with our family members and friends who have gone on before us, we treasure our time on earth and pray that we will be found faithful to His calling.


## Lowell and Claudia Wertz, on furlough from Africa

At the start of our furlough, I didn't have time to learn the GPS system in our new truck. Our first few trips we navigated the old fashion way. After getting lost several times, Claudia laid down the law. "Get out to the truck and learn that GPS" she told me at 10PM one night. It took me about 15 minutes.

Most of the time it is a tremendous help. But it is not 100% trustworthy. It tried to put us on an interstate going the wrong way, brought us to a dead-end street instead of a church, and one memorable night it brought us to a field of deer instead of our campground.

Some people say all religions are good and are like spokes on a wheel, they all lead you to God. The thought is that all religious roads get you to the same place. I can assure you not all roads lead to the same place!

Christianity teaches there is only one way to God and that brings us to Christmas and why it is so very important. The cost of our salvation and forgiveness was so high that God has made it clear He will never accept any other way for our salvation. He will never allow anything to diminish what Jesus did and why it was necessary. He is the one plan, one way, one Savior, and one road to eternal life. No other road will get you there. You can trust God 100% on this.

## **OUR LENTEN FOCUS**

Lent, the church-year season that begins on Ash Wednesday, is a time of penitence and spiritual renewal. Some people give up a luxury or vice during Lent as a form of self-denial; others undertake a project that benefits others.

The point isn't to denigrate ourselves or to see how much we can do without. Instead, Lent helps us reflect on Jesus' death. As Timothy Keller writes in The Reason for God: "The Christian Gospel is that I am so flawed that Jesus had to die for me, yet I am so loved and valued that Jesus was glad to die for me. This leads to deep humility and deep confidence at the same time. It undermines both swaggering and sniveling. I cannot feel superior to anyone, and yet I have nothing to prove to anyone. I do not think more of myself nor less of myself. Instead, I think of myself less."



#### What you need:

- Graham crackers
- Chocolate chips
- Microwave-safe bowl
- Zippered baggie
- Scissors
- Raspberries
- Blueberries

## What you do:

- 1. Gently break cracker sheets in half to form squares.
- Heat chocolate chips in microwave for 30 seconds. Stir, then continue heating for 30 seconds at a time until melted.
- 3. Spoon melted chocolate into baggie and snip a small triangle from one bottom corner.
- 4. On each cracker, squeeze chocolate lines to form a Tic-Tac-Toe board. Let cool.
- 5. Using the fruit as X's and O's, play Tic-Tac-Toe with a friend. The winner gets to eat the treat!

## SHEPHERD'S CROOK

The shepherd's crook is a symbol for Jesus, the Good Shepherd. "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." (John 10:11) The crook also symbolizes the shepherds who visited the baby Jesus in Bethlehem. It's also used in connection with King David, who worked as a shepherd when he was young.
