From The Pastor's Heart



It is hard to believe that Easter is around the corner. Along with the hope of warmer days, budding trees and flowers, we can even look forward to Spring Training news as we gear up for spring. For many, the Easter and Lenten season is a time that we focus on spring and life. It's kind of ironic because we know just before Jesus' death, Jesus also promised there would be the hope of new life!

The word Lent means spring. However, for many Christians it is a time of introspection, and remembering what

amazing love and example Jesus set for us back some 2000 years ago. It's also a time to prepare our own hearts and lives as part of this reflection. On the first day of Lent (Ash Wednesday,) some Christians choose to mark their foreheads with ash as a symbol of sorrow and mourning over their sin and of repentance.

Some Christians choose to give up a habit or behavior during Lent as an exercise in prayerful self-denial. This might range from something as simple as not drinking soda or coffee during Lent to a full-blown program of fasting. Some Christians commit to a special devotional activity during Lent. Some examples are, daily Scripture reading, regular prayer for a specific person or topic throughout Lent, serving others you know or doing volunteer work in our community.

The choice to observe Lent is a personal one. The whole point is to focus your heart and mind on Jesus during the journey to Easter, to draw close to Him. There's no requirement to observe it, nor should you feel guilted into participating. However, millions of Christians around the world do observe Lent each year. If you've never done so, why not give it a try? Whether you observe Lent in a small or major way, you'll be amazed at what happens when you devote part of each day reflecting on Jesus Christ and God's Word,

allowing God's love to transform you. This journey reminds me of something I read from Rick Warren recently. He was sharing about one of his favorite spiritual heroes, Dr E.V. Hill, whom has certainly been one of mine through the years, too.

Dr. E.V. Hill, pastor of the Mount Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Los Angeles, was a tremendous man of God and an intellectual giant. He was also a man of integrity who was not afraid to call it as he saw it. Because of the many times in his ministry he called out injustice in inner-city L.A., he faced constant death threats.


After something he said one Sunday morning, there was a threat that he was going to be bombed during the next week, and he took it very seriously. One day that week, he came home and noticed his car wasn't there. He immediately thought that either somebody had stolen it or someone was tampering with it and planting a bomb in it. He sat down on his front steps, deeply worried. About 30 minutes later, his wife, who was well aware of the threat, drove up in that very same car.

"What are you doing?" he yelled, frightened that she had taken such a risk. She said, "I got to thinking. This community needs you more than it needs me. If they were going to rig that car to be bombed, I wanted me to be in it, not you." Dr. Hill later said, "I always knew that my wife loved me. But then I finally understood what love was all about and Mrs. Hill knew that love is not something you feel. Love is not something you say. Love is something you do.

This is how we know what love is: "Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters."

1 John 3:16 Notice the action step in our new Scripture of the month. Love makes a choice every day to do for others what God has done for us. You don't have to wonder what it means to love. God showed us clearly what love does, and then He gave us the greatest example of love when he gave us Jesus. May we love others like Jesus, everyone and everywhere!



Decision 2020

A Way Forward for FUMC Collingswood

It is clear from the events following the General Conference of February 2019, including the votes taken at the 10/26/19 Greater NJ Annual Conference, that the discord within the United Methodist denomination is not settled – and perhaps has even increased. There are various proposals getting some attention for what may transpire at the 2020 General Conference as well, but there seems to be universal agreement on only one point: some type of split within the denomination is coming – <u>and local churches will have a decision to make regarding their future affiliation</u>.

We at FUMC Collingswood have been praying and patiently waiting for the denominational issues to become clear, and though there are still many unanswered questions, we can wait no longer. We must recognize that 2020 will be a year of decision about the future of our local church, and to make that decision as an entire church body, we must make sure that all members are informed of the issues and are best-prepared to take part in that decision when the time arrives.

To that end, below is a schedule of meeting dates that are open to all members of the church. There are multiple dates when the same information will be discussed, because not everyone is available at one specific time throughout the week. People may attend as many as they like, but all are strongly encouraged to attend at least one meeting on each discussion topic, so that everyone is informed to a reasonably consistent degree. Please mark your calendars.

<u>Part II – Understanding Our Options:</u> What are the different paths we have to choose from? What happens if we don't make a definitive choice? When do we really have to make a decision?



Chuck and Bev Truxton, Nigeria

We've enjoyed another year of being involved in the lives of our family in Pennsylvania while still having the opportunity of being involved in ministry in Nigeria. Chuck has continued to make trips back to Miango. Through your generosity many now have easy access to clean drinking water; the expressions of thanks and appreciation just keep coming!

But at this Christmas season we'd like to talk about a mother and her baby. Well, this baby is now 23 years old now! But when Bev first knew Rosemary, Victor was just one year old, brought to the hospital in need of surgery. One year earlier he was the baby who nearly got left in a rubbish heap out of desperation. (See their story below.)

During his most recent visit to Nigeria, Chuck was able to make contact with Rosemary and son Victor - who is now a student at University of Jos. Victor reminded us that many of you helped sponsor him to summer camp as a teenager! He says that was an important influence in his life; he wanted us to thank you for that. Rosemary is now attending a course in catering and hopes to open her own small road-side restaurant in Jos. We praise the Lord for his grace and blessing in the lives of this mother and her son.

We'd like to add our own word of thanks to you for your continued support both through prayer and gifts that God is using to help sustain us and also to assist those in Nigeria who need help.

The Scrapheap Baby - Rosemary and Victor's Story

It was the city dump. Rosemary knew it wouldn't be a pretty place. But the smell was worse than she had imagined and there were rats everywhere. Of course there were rats; a collection of all the city's refuse would surely attract rats!

A teenage runaway who had turned to prostitution, Rosemary now found herself with a baby boy she was convinced she couldn't care for. So tossing him seemed to be the solution. Rosemary had gotten on the transit bus and headed out of the city to find a place where she thought no one would be watching. At the end of the line she got off and there it was: a place where people dumped things they didn't want. Just the right place she thought.

But she hadn't thought about the rats. Somehow Rosemary had pictured finding a soft secluded place to lay her baby down gently and cover him over with the cloth that was now wrapped around him. He would look up at her and know that she was only doing what she had to do. She would walk quietly away and everything would be OK again.

But everything was not OK. He was crying now; he needed her. And it was the rats that clinched it. One very big one moved very close and stood on his back legs sniffing the air. No, this was not the place for her son. She didn't know how they would survive, or even if they would survive. But this was not where her son's life would end. Not here, not today.

The dilapidated hotel where they were living was not a good place; Rosemary was often abused and beaten. But no one touched her baby. When Victor was just one year old he became violently ill with vomiting and abdominal pain. Some Nigerian Christian workers on an outreach to prostitutes brought them to our Evangel Hospital and that's how Rosemary and Victor came into our lives.

With treatment and surgery, Victor got better physically. But more than physical care, Rosemary experienced a love and compassion from Bev and the other hospital staff that really ministered to her needy heart. She accepted Christ as her savior and began a journey of discipleship in a nearby transition house, memorizing more than 200 scripture verses and allowing the Word of God to take root in her life.

I am writing you in regard to all the birthday cards I have received from you all throughout the years. God has placed it on my heart to reflect back to the very day we met. What I never thought about was the dedication the Saints have shown me over the years by making sure I felt loved and thought of on my birthday. I have another seven years to go before my release date and carry the joy of Jesus with me every

Total cost will be approximately \$1350. If you are interested in going, please make a notation on the tear-off section of your bulletin or let Pastor Matt know.









- · 2 plastic spoons
- Masking tape

- 5. Experiment with sounds by filling other eggs with coins, rice, and so on.
