

Taking a walk this week, I noticed a familiar scene: Leaves are beginning to fall; a cool nip is in the air. The season of summer is over and fall is here, moving us towards winter. Every season has its own, unique blend of opportunities and challenges. However, the fall season can be a simple time of reflection, a time to assess the deeper things of life.

As we enter this time of the year there, is so much we can be grateful for. I love reflecting on how God has blessed us in so many ways. When we think of how God has guided us through another year, day by day, knowing that He is in charge, we are blessed. As we celebrate this time of the year everyone has a reason to be thankful. I love the reasons some children gave their teacher when asked why they like Thanksgiving:

Mary, age 8:	"Because	it's	the	season	where	everyone	joins
together."							

- Kyle, age 6: *"Because it's a happy day and my grandma cooks a lot especially cookies."*
- Fred, age 5: "I love Thanksgiving because there is so much to be thankful for."

This past month has been a special time for all of us as we've been focusing on simply **DRAWING NEAR** to God and then watching God work in our lives, the families in our church and community. There are times we face difficult and unexpected life challenges and decisions. We can learn much from the words penned from apostle Paul: "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)

Apostle Paul is calling followers of Jesus to an amazing life here...not an easy life, but a great one. Paul's words challenge us that a joyful, thankful and prayerful life is more than a November holiday. It's a lifestyle. This begs a question for me: **How can we** give thanks in all circumstances in every season of life? What happens when we GROW in our thankfulness? I found the following response in some notes I found. I'm not sure where I got this, but one I wanted to share this with you.

#### G - Give yourself to others.

Thanksgiving, to be truly Thanksgiving, is first thanks, then giving. To some of you, expression of gratitude to God could be in the form of giving financially to a charity, to some other of you, expression of gratitude to God could be in the form of serving others – not because they deserve it, but because God expects it.

#### **R** - Reflect on God's goodness.

It has often been pointed out that thinking precedes thanking. When we are presented with a gift, it is because we think of its significance and meaning that we are led to express our appreciation. So start with your reflection about the goodness of God every day, and in every way. God is good.

#### **O** - Overcome discouragement through praise.

The best weapon against discouragement is praise and thanksgiving. Whenever you feel discouraged you should praise and give thanks to God right away. Learn from the Psalms of how people give thanks to God amidst their circumstances. Listen to praise songs, singing them out loud and let the lyrics remind you of the good grace of God.

#### W - Walk in the light of an amazing God.

God is sovereign. God is in control. God knows how things must work out for good. That means all I have comes from Him, and as such I should be thankful. The bigger God become in your life the easier for you to give thanks to Him; so enlarge your vision of God, keep looking up until you see Him, and then He will even be bigger still.

When we are thankful, it's just about impossible to be hopeless. It's much harder to be greedy or envious, or to be demanding or fixated on your own needs. If you are thankful, (Continued on page 18)


Dear Barbara never questioned God's care, living in a palm or ramshackle dwelling, nursing me "done in" with malaria and I caring for her whenever ill. Barbara always put others first, raising our 5 who excelled in Portuguese and in other languages.

They graduated from Bible colleges, universities and specialized training. Barbara and I prayed daily for kids, spouses, the grand kids and "greats." When I could help Barbara recall God's every care of all, she had good cries of joy and rejoicing when I told her how God has kept each one in His loving care, tears of joy and gratefulness flowed!

Engaged in high school, we married during Bible college, studied linguistics, missionary medicine, each step as God led us

along. To our Savior and Lord all glory and praise. Barbara in Heaven, me (Alan) here, and our five children and families: Daniel and Renata, Paul and Elizabeth, David and Aldenora, Tim and Avanilde, Beth and Jonas.


Right now, as I write this, we are anxiously awaiting word from a very dear friend, Robin Weatherford, on Abaco Island in the Bahamas. He works among Haitians who have ended up on that island in their efforts to escape the unbearable conditions in Haiti. Hurricane Dorian has virtually obliterated Abaco and, because communications are disrupted, we don't know how Robin, the church, and the Haitian brothers and sisters fared in the storm. We know that several on the island have died. To see the unbelievable destruction of the island on the news takes our breath away. They will need a lot of help, for sure, in restoring what has been blown to smithereens by Dorian. I hope to visit them before long to see how I can help.

The situation in Haiti is also very sad indeed. The poverty is unmerciful and widespread, crime is rampant, and the political situation is chaotic with roadblocks, threats, violence and virtual anarchy. All in a so far unsuccessful effort to overthrow the president. Praise the Lord, in the midst of the turmoil the gospel is more powerful than ever; churches are thriving and the faith of believers is strong. We communicate almost daily with friends there and help as best we can from a distance. As I did earlier this year, I am again scheduled to go to Haiti in February as chaplain and translator for a team of surgeons and nurses. I look forward to being with these skilled medical volunteers and our Haitian brothers and sisters again. God always uses my time with them to humble my heart to be a faithful servant as they are in the midst of trouble. Please pray for this suffering nation we love and its many believers.

#### Mark and Carol Hepner, Ohio

I leave once again for Papua New Guinea (PNG) on Oct 8. I'll be gone for eight weeks. I'll be leading a Translator Training Workshop for 14 people and 10 of those folks will be staying on for the Translation Consultant Training Workshop that will immediately follow. Those two workshops will be held at the main SIL center, Ukarumpa. During that time 1 will also do the pre-publication consultant check of the Gospel of Mark in the Kapin language. Then I'll travel to Lae town on the coast of Morobe Province to do some more training with the seven Papua New Guinea translation teams working in the Huon Gulf cluster project. During my weeks in Lae, I will help a consultant check the book of Genesis in the Buang language and supervise a Papua New Guinean consultant trainee as he tries his hand at checking some of that book as well.

We would appreciate your prayers for the folks who will attend these various training opportunities and "face-to-face" consultant checking sessions, and for Carol and myself as well. December will mark our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary as members of Wycliffe and I've been feeling my age for a while now. I've never been a fireball of energy and so, for me, the travel is tiring, the teaching is tiring, and the cross-cultural translation checking is, well, tiring. But I'm honored and content to get tired for the Kingdom. Despite the weariness, these PNG trips are always the highlight of my year. As always, our goal is to see Papua New Guinean believers eagerly reading the Scriptures in their own mother-tongues. We long to see them reading their translations because they have an over-riding, Spirit-inspired desire to please and honor God the way Jesus did, with the kind of consistency and perseverance that Jesus demonstrated, even when it got him into hot water with his own people. These are lofty goals, and translation work is only part of the process of seeing "God's kingdom come and God's will being done on earth the same way it's done in heaven." But it's an important part, and we are so glad that many of you have teamed up with us to help that process move forward. Please pray for strength and stamina for me, for the provision of our "daily bread," and for Carol's well-being during the coming weeks of separation.

the church office. You are also welcome to drop by the sound booth or control room and talk to any of our operators.


