

# From The Pastor's Heart

## LOVE LIKE THAT

As we head into the fall, it's hard to believe we have just celebrated our pancake breakfast and shared our vision for the "Draw Near" to God emphasis. It was exciting to see 40 plus children and staff in the gym enjoying pancakes and getting ready for the fall classes. At the same time, we had a great group of adults and students upstairs in the Great Room Temple anticipating both the Sunday School classes and where God is leading us in the fall.

Our prayer, for us as individuals and as a church family, is that each of us would experience a special drawing in by God "Draw near to God and he will draw near to you." (James 4:8) The world, spaces, places and people around us can pull us, even briefly at times, away from the things that draw us close to the heart and purposes of the Lord.

We see this with the cultural stresses of the world and we pray for the Greater United Methodist Church for renewal and revival. We also need to continue to pray for our local mission here in Collingswood, the challenges with the school lease process, and other challenges we face as God's people in the days in which we live. To carry out our Lord's mission and the kingdom vision of Jesus, we must draw near.

On Sunday mornings, we will begin a new sermon series that we are excited about. The series is called "Love like that." The journey will challenge us to be looking at how Jesus loved and how we can do the same. Just think what would happen if we loved ourselves, our families, friends and world like Jesus. This series is inspired by a book by Dr. Les Parrott, *Love Like That*.

Let's be honest. How many times have we fallen short at being a good friend, a wise parent, or a self-giving spouse or caring neighbor because we didn't love—truly love—at the highest level? It's tough. It's easy to fall short. The bar is high, especially if we aspire to love like Jesus. But it's not impossible. As followers of Jesus, we are meant to radically love those around us and give the world a glimpse of what God is like. But this is easier said than done. What does it actually mean to love like Jesus? And why do we so quickly get bogged down in our own selfishness, sin, and futile efforts?

In this 6-part sermon series, we will journey together and examine Jesus' life and character traits to give practical definition to what it means to love like Jesus. The Holy Spirit invites us to trade detachment, exclusivity, judgment, fear, and self-concern for mindfulness, approachability, grace, boldness, and self-giving. He empowers us to love like Jesus, and frees us to experience genuine joy. As we journey together in this study of God's word this fall, I believe not only we will see a transformation in our own lives and relationships, but also witness spiritual awakening in our church, which can extend to our greater communities. "Love like that" will guide us to desire deeply to relate to others and communicate the message of the gospel with awesome, biblical, Christ-empowered love.

My prayer is that we will draw closer and nearer to the Lord and learn to love like Jesus—to "Love Like That." Will you join me in that journey in the days ahead?





### Dick and Mary Ann McCloy, South Carolina

Dick is gearing up for the fall classes. Praise: We have been given longer teaching times and the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders will each have their own class time rather than together, which makes for extra buses and teaching staff. Pray for all of this to come together well. Also pray as the letters go out to the parents that the Lord will give us His choice students for the fall, winter and spring classes. We also have the opportunity this time to be at the parents open house evening with a table to help parents become acquainted with School Time Bible of SC and the classes available to their students. Yes, this is DURING the school day when students are released from non-core subjects to attend the class. FCA and Good News club are either before or after school as clubs. There are different rules for each. Pray for the school students of America to once again know God's Word and to value life. Pray for revival of God's people in America.

We praise the Lord for the wonderful times He has given us this summer with family and friends and we thank you for your continued prayers for us and our family and "retreaded" ministry in SC. Let us know if YOU are traveling down this way and can stop in too. You are most welcome!

## Larry and Fay Buckman, South America

Two major events are quickly approaching. We have been invited to take 15 indigenous missionaries to a Call2All conference in Rio de Janeiro. This will be the first opportunity our missionaries will have to present their mission of reaching indigenous tribes on a major stage. We are expecting 4,000 leaders. In preparations, our indigenous leaders went with me to Brasilia to invite Dr. Damares Alves, the Minister of Human Rights, to challenge our Brazilian churches to support the indigenous initiatives. She has been a long-time friend in Congress, but God has raised her up to represent a clear Christian voice on our behalf. Pray as we expect many to answer God's call.

Later in October, Ben (my son) and I will be traveling to Mozambique and Malawi to train pastors in Biblical Counseling using Genesis 1-11. All the major sins are there, followed by God's response. We'll be teaching in Portuguese to 100 pastors in

Mozambique at two sites. In Malawi it will be in English to 75 pastors at two locations. Pray for our security in travel, especially the land portions. We're still raising funds for the training materials that will be duplicated in Malawi (\$300.) Feeding and transportation for 100 pastors for two weeks will be about \$2,000.

Remember to send us any second-hand smart phones you would like to donate for our indigenous missionaries. We received one so far.

There is always lots to do and pray for as we move forward in faith. But God is before us, who can be against us? We praise the Lord for great health and protection as we minister.


Hearing of the unrest in Hong Kong, we have been concerned for the safety of a Chinese brother and sister, who wrote, "It's probably the worst social and political turmoil since the 1967 riot against the British. We feel emotionally disturbed. We are constantly exposed to negative news and violent scenes. More and more people are suffering from psychological problems. May the Lord make great use of all Christians so that love, peace and respect and forgiveness can glue our society together again..." Do pray with us for the believers in Hong Kong.

As we write this Update Neale's Mom (93) in Wisconsin is now under hospice care in the Memory Care unit where she has been for two years. Having had a special time with her in June during which we prayed together and, each of us realizing our good-byes might be our last before together again in Heaven, we haven't made another trip to see her (though there are many heart tugs!). Her homegoing will be an answer to her prayers, and the longing of Jesus as well, who prayed, Father, I desire that they also, whom You have given Me, be with Me where I am [John 17.24]. Thank you for your prayers for Mom and for us.

A dear friend recently shared a challenging quote from Oswald Chambers: "Character is made by things done steadily and persistently, not by the exceptional or spasmodic; that is something God mourns over. It is inbred in us that we have to do exceptional things for God, but we do not. We have to be exceptional in ordinary things, to be holy in mean streets, among mean people." Our prayer is that the fruit of the Spirit which is goodness will be displayed in our lives in the ordinary tasks and happenings each new day.



## Wings of Prayer



"Amen." We say it automatically at the end of every prayer we utter. We say it in response to another person closing in prayer. We use it to show agreement with something someone has spoken or written. And, according to certain Facebook posts, we're supposed to type it in the comments to prove that we believe in God, ensure we will go to heaven, increase our chances to win a million dollars, help someone get a kidney transplant, or all of the above! Okay, that last one isn't true. But, have you ever stopped to think why we say "Amen," or what the actual meaning of the word is?

According to the Merriam-Webster dictionary, the definition is: Amen --used to express solemn ratification (as of an expression of faith) or hearty approval (as of an assertion.)


The word, which can mean "let it be," "so be it," "verily," and "truly," first occurs in the Hebrew Bible in Numbers 5:22. It is part of instructions for a test that God was commanding be used. He stated that this is how the person being tested was to respond. When the priest addresses a suspected adulteress, she is to respond "Amen, amen." Overall, the word appears in the Hebrew Bible 30 times.

When we say "Amen" after someone else prays, we are showing our agreement with what has been said and it shows that we join in the praises, confessions, requests and thanks that have been offered.

When we close our own prayers with that word, we are basically saying that we have said all we have to say and we are leaving it there with God. We need to remember this. Saying "Amen" is like closing a book after we have finished reading. It is telling God that we are trusting that he has heard our prayer, is acting on it, and that we will accept his answer. I may start ending my prayers by saying "So be it" instead of "Amen". Saying "Amen" has become so automatic that changing the words, while not changing the meaning, might help me remember why I am praying...and, more importantly, to whom I am praying.

This portable snack combines favorite fall flavors.



#### What you need:

- 1/4 cup maple syrup
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- 1/8 tsp. salt
- 2/3 cup pecan pieces
- 1/3 cup roasted pumpkin seeds
- 1/3 cup almonds
- 1/4 cup raisins
- 2/3 cup dried fruit (any)

## What you do:

- Microwave syrup, spices, seeds and nuts for 30 seconds at a time, stirring frequently, until mixture thickens.
- Spread the mixture on a baking sheet lined with wax paper. Let cool and harden.
- Break the candied nuts into chunks. Combine with dried fruit.
- 4. Store in airtight container.
