



Ethiopia is once again in the headlines all over the world. This time for the horrendous crash of a flight between Addis – Abba and Kenya. 157 souls perished on that flight including 22 workers for the UN.

Pat and I had just flown out a few days prior to the accident having spent a wonderful time with our son Tim and his wife Mona. We were introduced to two very different worlds. One world was the academic and privileged world of the International Community School of Addis (ICS) where Tim serves as Head of School.

And then there is the world of deep poverty, daily survival and illiteracy where Mona is heavily involved in a number of Christian NGOs. There was light shining at the end of the tunnel as I heard testimony after testimony as to how God led these men and women to have such faith, love, compassion and hope for children who were sold into sex trafficking, others living off on the largest garbage heap I've ever seen and a ministry of "Douglas," helping mothers who are choosing to have babies and raise them alone rather than abort them. Our son, Troy, his wife, Cristi, and their son Caleb joined us in Addis and helped with the physical plant for this ministry and clothing for the babies. They flew back to the States the same day as the Boeing 737 crash.

We just received a note from Mona: "Today Tim is speaking with one hundred Ethiopian Airlines personnel to offer words of encouragement and consolation. Pilots and flight attendants. Thanks for your prayers that God will give him a Spirit-anointed and powerful 'our best with Africa and our world' moment."

This event has taken place. There were far more than 100 present and much crying and grieving took place. Pray for the words that were spoken would penetrate the heart of these folks who lost a whole crew of colleagues and friends. We are thankful that God has seen fit to raise up a Prime Minister who is a practicing believer in Jesus Christ. May Ethiopia return to its roots of the Ethiopian Eunuch who was baptized by Phillippe!

Thank you for your faithful prayers on our and our family's behalf. This is the only way to move forward in sowing and reaping Eternal Harvest.

For years I have wanted to say "thank you," but I never seemed to get around to it. I kept thinking that I "won't hear from them this year" and made excuses for my not writing. But that is my fault and I was raised better than that. I just want you at the Saints Prison Ministry to know how grateful I am, and despite being embarrassed at taking so long I think this is a privilege to share this moment with you. Sometimes when you are at a very low moment, something unexpected happens in your life when you need your spirit lifted up. I thank the Lord for the Saints Prison Ministry being that something special, and I know there are other prisoners that feel the same way.

Out of almost 300 4A teams, the Jaguars made it to the final game, facing 3-time winner San Elizario from El Paso. Going into overtime at 0-0, our boys fought hard, but were eventually outscored 1-0. 






WHAT RAIN REVEALS


