

May is an amazing month to reflect upon so much of what God has done and is doing in our midst. As we celebrate Moms and Memorial Day, we know that each of these days has special meaning in our lives. I look forward as we get closer to summer, my favorite time of the year. I love to take a trip down to the shore or to the mountains and look at the beauty and vastness of nature. Then I realize my smallness compared to God's greatness and the earth's grandeur.

I was talking with someone this week and we were reflecting on the greatness of God and about how much God cares for us. We talked about how much God loves us especially in the midst of the things that challenge us. As we look around our world, culture, the church and personal lives we see many challenges these days, but we also see God's hand in so many ways. God is greater than all our challenges and does not waste our challenges but can use them for His plan.

I was reading a devotional by the Denison family that focused on Jesus as the great Shepherd. I share part of this with you to encourage you this month:

Jesus is the most equipped guide we could ever have. He holds all of creation in the palm of his hand, and yet he knows the number of hairs on our head. He is the God of the gigantic and a lover of every little detail about us. And He longs to lead us to safe pasture. As we look at the parable of God as the Good Shepherd today, allow your faith and affections to be stirred by God's promise to guide you into the matchless life he has in store for you.

John 10:14-15 says, "I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep." Jesus paved the way for us to enter into the most amazing pasture of all: the very presence of the living God. He laid down his life as our Good Shepherd that we might eat of the fruit of his death and resurrection. But God didn't only lead us to heaven; he continually leads us as our Good Shepherd day in and day out.


In the <u>Psalm 23</u> David writes, "The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows." (Psalm 23:1-6).

God's staff is meant to comfort us. As our Good Shepherd he promises to lead us daily to the plans he has for us. That doesn't always mean that we will be led out of "the valley of the shadow of death," but that in the valley he will "prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies." Our great comfort is the fact that God will never leave us or forsake us (<u>Deuteronomy 31:6</u>). As <u>Psalm</u> <u>139:9-10</u> says, "If I take the wings of the morning and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me." God is with us in times of trouble. He will protect us, provide for us, and lead us to still waters.

God longs to guide you today. What trouble is before you? Where do you need guidance? Where do you need help? God promises to be your Good Shepherd. You have the most high God on your side. You can trust Him to lead and guide you.

Take some time today and remember and reflect that you have the great Shepherd to lead and guide you every step of the way. Now that's something to be thankful for!



SAFE SANCTUARY TRAINING





Dear Church Family,

As many of you are aware our church is joining again with Aldine United Methodist Church for a short-term missions trip to Teamwork Christian Academy in Montego Bay Jamaica. An exciting thing about this trip is that Pastor Sam is joining us for his first overseas missions trip, hopefully.

This trip is serving primarily as a work trip with a water system replacement project of the entire Teamwork property. We are excited to be able to provide and install a reliable source of potable water to the center. This will allow them to have better use of their property and allow them to provide housing for missionary groups to once again stay on site which is a primary source of income for them to run their Christian center. Additionally, we will have 5-7 team members doing evangelism as well as serving our work team. The dates of the trip are 6/2 thru 6/9. Four team members are going 4 days in advance, including Bob Albers brother -in-law who is the water systems engineer on the project.

Those coming from our church are Pastor Sam, Ken Steward (Project Lead,) Joan Steward, Harry Rameriz, Ed Davis, Emily Davis, Michael Molloy, Bill Wertz and Tyson Chamberlain. There are 6 others coming not from FUMC.

In ministry news, we are looking at some changes to our lives in the months ahead. For a couple of years, we have been praying and seeking for someone to fill our shoes in our current role as Regional Ministry Director for the Canadian team. Realizing that we cannot continue in this role for many more years, we had our eye on a couple who are part of our team but asking them to move out of their community where they have made so many inroads was not something we wanted to do.

However, last year they began to sense God was nudging them to consider making a change and so they are now excited about moving to Whitehorse after their two children finish school late this Spring! Once they are settled here, we will pass the baton on to them and will be available to assist where needed. We are confident they can do the job with minimal overlap, and we want to be as supportive as possible in making this a successful transition. Please pray for housing in Whitehorse for the Bakers. With all the housing that has been built here in the past eight years, it is still a very tight market!

So what does this change mean for us you may ask? SEND North is approaching a critical time in August when our current Treasurer/CFO Clive Donaldson will be retiring and moving out of Alaska. Thus far, SEND has not been able to recruit someone to fill his shoes. When Clive was asked who he thought could do the job from within the mission, he indicated that Ken would be his choice. Since we are already on the field and fully supported, it makes the most sense in the short-term for Ken to step into this role until a long -term individual can be found.

Ken has agreed to take on this position in order to allow Clive to retire as planned with the understanding that SEND will continue to advertise for this need. We would appreciate your prayers for the learning curve that he'll be working through in the months/year ahead.



Barbara's memory (dementia) declines noticeably, now only mobile with my help. Two years ago, she walked well. My care of her is 24/7. I take Barbara in our golf cart as possible. A retired nurse graciously stays with Barbara on specific occasions while I minister on TV and Spanish Services.

There is a community church, vibrant, a blessing to many from all walks of life, centered in biblical teaching. "It's all about Jesus." Barbara loves worshipping. She remembers hymns from our youth before Brasil. She focuses on Bible teaching while she listens. Our church transmits on the Village TV. I have been asked to present a 1/2 hour TV devotional twice monthly in English and once in Spanish.

Twice monthly, I work with the leader of a "Care Giver" group to offer, guidance and encouragement to those dealing with issues often dissimilar in varying aspects. I bring Barbara. It is imperative that the care givers not feel them to be the victim, get over wrought and burn out!

One day at a time! This 63rd year of "wedlock" is a continuing commitment made to our LORD at 19 when we exchanged vows before God and men. Grateful to God for you.

MOUNTAIN VIEWS By Marion Wertz

How big a mountain appears to you depends on where you are viewing it from. If you are standing in the valley looking up at the mountain, it seems enormous and insurmountable. If you live on the side of the mountain, you become used to it. You know that it's there, but it's become a part of your everyday life. You have figured out the safest paths to travel by, and sometimes you even forget that you are on a mountain. Finally, if you have your back to the mountain, and are looking in another direction, you don't see it, have no idea how big it is, and you may not even realize that it's there.

When we first encounter a difficult time in our lives, we are standing in the valley staring up at the peak. We can't imagine ever getting over that mountain. This is when we need to acknowledge who God is and that he is bigger than any mountain we will ever face. We don't necessarily need to scale the mountain, because God can remove it altogether!

When we have difficult situations in our lives for a long time, we become like the people who live on the mountain. The difficulty becomes part of who we are. We get used to carrying the weight. We may even think that this is the way our lives are meant to be and become resigned to living a life without hope. But we can be encouraged that God wants good things for us! As Romans 5:5 tells us, "...hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out within our hearts through the Holy Spirit who was given to us." It may not turn out the way we imagine, but God has promised us that we will see his goodness. Psalm 27:13-14 tells us: "I remain confident of this: I will see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living. Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord."

We all have mountains in our lives. Things that are so big we can't imagine ever being able to scale them, much less move them. And yet, in the verse above, God is essentially telling us that we can tell the mountains in our lives to "go jump in a lake." The key lies our faith and where we place it. It's not about believing that we ourselves are capable of overcoming difficulties, but in believing that God is bigger than any mountain that we face. "*Then Jesus said*, '*Did I not tell you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?*'" John 11:40

Understand, though, this doesn't mean that God will grant anything we ask as though he were some sort of magic genie. Our desires must be within God's will for our lives. As it says in 1 John 5:14-15, "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him."

The mountains will always be there. We need to be like the person who turns their back to the mountain and focuses on something else. The something else that we need to focus on is God. We need to remember that he is bigger than any mountains in our lives. He is the one who created them, therefore he is capable of moving them. Our job is to remember who he is, trust him, and have faith in his ability to handle anything that we come up against.


