

Wow, it is hard to believe we are already thinking about February, the month of "LOVE" and Valentine's Day and candy and more snow and Super Bowl! For those diehard Eagles fans, it's bittersweet not having our team playing this year.


However, I want you to think about the greatest expression of love that comes to your mind. Maybe your mind may go to a time when puppy love came on the scene, or you can reflect on those in your life nearest and dearest to you. However, the greatest demonstration of love I find in my life is Jesus, when he was willing to sacrifice everything for me and love me unconditionally...that changed my life!

Now Jesus calls us to love the Lord our God with all our heart, mind, soul and strength and to have a deep love for others that calls us to love our neighbor in new and transforming ways. As we look to 2019, a year of <u>"SHARING GOD'S LOVE,"</u> our heart's prayer is to allow Jesus' love to guide us through this all-important calling in our lives. There are clever ways that provoke our thinking about who Jesus loved. Jesus was about the last, the least and the lost. I'm so glad for that focus because that's how I got included in His love and grace.

How we live that relationship by listening and growing in our relationship with God that makes a difference is what counts. I was reading an article by Dr. Jim Denison this last week about growing in our faith and thought I share it with you as we grow in faith together: How can we experience more of God? Psalm 13 is David's plea for help in a hard place. He begins with transparent honesty: "How long, O LORD? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? ... How long shall my enemy be exalted over me?" (vv. 1-2) He needs help immediately "lest I sleep the sleep of death." (v. 3b)

Despite God's apparent silence, David continues to pray: "Consider and answer me, O LORD my God." (v. 3a) Why? Note the tenses of his answer: "I have trusted in your steadfast love; my heart shall rejoice in your salvation." (v. 5) Then he reverses the order: "I will sing to the LORD, because he has dealt bountifully with me." (v. 6)

David learned from God's faithfulness in the past to trust his faithfulness for the future. Because the Lord's nature does not change (Malachi 3:6; Hebrews 13:8), all that he has done. he can still do.



"The issue of faith"

You and I can follow David's example today. Name a need you need God to meet. Find a time in your experience and/or Scripture when he met it. Ask him to do so again and trust that he hears you and will answer you in whatever way is best.

Your trust will position you to experience your Father's grace. <u>And your faith will be a powerful witness to a culture that</u> often doubts faith.

R. C. Sproul: "The issue of faith is not so much whether we believe in God, but whether we believe the God we believe in." Do we?

May each of us take the opportunity to experience God's love so we might share it in the places and space we live.

• Friday and Saturday - for 24 hours of prayer (sign up in the church office.)




WEDNESDAY NIGHT LIVE (WNL) Something for Everyone!


FOUNDATIONS CLASS

Where and when? Room 305 at First United Methodist beginning Sunday, February 3, 2019 during Discipleship Hour 9:45 - 10:25 am.




Opportunities for Serving in 2019



Neale and Barbara Goetch, SC and England

Thank you for praying as we delivered the 2019 Chinese Scripture text calendars in South Carolina. We were met with knowing smiles at each restaurant and take-away. Because the Chinese New Year doesn't begin until February 5^{th} , we combined our New Year wishes with Christmas greetings. There is an interesting story from Chinese lore about the approaching 'Year of the Pig'; When the Jade emperor had invited all the animals to a feast, the pig arrived very late. Some think he overslept while others suggest that after the wolf had blown his house down (western culture has a similar tale, doesn't it?) he was delayed, being preoccupied with making repairs. In retelling the advent of the Savior, we related that God is never late-that in the fullness of time—the time He had purposed and planned in eternity past—Jesus came, and the challenge is that His invitation to come to Him by faith is not to be put off. Pray with us that those who have not trusted Christ will see their need of Jesus, and that many who we sense are believers will be encouraged by the message on the calendars. Since we will be in England in February, we are taking calendars along with us to give out there as well.

The list of Chinese friends that want to get together while we are in the UK is growing. Pray that the Lord will strengthen for those travels and give eternal significance to those visits. Some are not yet trusting the Savior.

Walt and Pat Stuart, France

This was primarily written by Harry Walker, Pat's nephew, and a Crossworld missionary as well.

The past four weekends have seen huge protests (and in some cases riots) in major French cities. The protests started against the hike in taxes on fuel. But in reality, the malaise goes deeper than a new gas tax.

"Fixing" Climate Change

The French solution to pollution was to hike the price of energy. However, with the French already paying \$6.50 a gallon, another 6% was huge. The protests began through "social media" (namely F.B.) and grew to huge proportions. Walt and Pat have been blocked often by "gilets jaunes" on the 1st weekend of the

protests. (See photo from our car.) After 4 weeks of protests, the president backed down on the tax increase, But it was too late! The retirees wanted their tax increase rescinded, and the minimum wage people wanted their share of the action. All three groups got what they wanted. When will the protests end? No one seems to know.

The Solution....

There is not one easy



solution. The protests degenerated into riots, destruction, and anarchy. President Macron promises to "get in touch" with the working class. He plans to survey the French mayors to see what people are really thinking. (France has 36,500 mayors!)

Sadly, France is a cameo of the world. Many people are angry, depressed and prone to violence. (See Habakkuk 1:1-5) We ask that you pray for peace in France, but also in the rest of the world. Maranatha, Lord Jesus come.

Strasbourg Christmas Market

Yesterday, a lone wolf terrorist attacked France's largest Christmas market. Three dead and a dozen people were wounded. Twenty-four hours later, the gunman, screamed "allahu akbar" as he was shooting. The terrorist was caught and killed last night. Please pray the God would move in this day of mourning. This is the city Famille Je t'aime has a Biblical Counseling training in session. We are convinced that prevention and healing is essential in the inner man to prevent anger from overflowing inside and outside the church. Let's know our calling and be faithful to it wherever we are!

May you all have a most meaningful Christmas and a New Year filled with many opportunities to share Christ!

Wings of *Prayer*



There are many reasons people are drawn to pray: need, habit, praise, obedience, gratitude, desperation, comfort. No matter the reason, God wants us to come to Him. He wants to give us our heart's desires. ("If you remain in me and my words remain in vou. ask whatever you wish and it


will be done for you." John 15:7) We may be worried about our eloquence, but He is much more interested in what our hearts have to say than our mouths. ("And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words." Matthew 6:7) Just be intentional. Be honest. He will meet you where you are and he will accept whatever you can offer him.

Sometimes we can't find the words. Our emotions are too great. I have often found myself wanting to call out to God, but being too overwhelmed by fear or pain to put my thoughts together. One of the most comforting scriptures for me personally tells us that when we are not able to find the words, the Holy Spirit prays for us, taking what is in our hearts directly to God. ("In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans." Romans 8:26) How amazing is that! God wants to hear our prayers so much that He gave us the Holy Spirit so we could always have a direct connection to Him, especially at the times when we need Him the most.

There are particularly sacred prayers that are barely audible, a single utterance that floats out under your breath, from the depths of your soul. *Help me... I can't... Jesus... Thank you...* These prayers are as deeply felt and important as a prayer of 1,000 words, and I believe God receives these prayers with extra tenderness. Sometimes a prayer is a long conversation. Sometimes we do a lot of fist shaking and yelling. Sometimes we share our joy and thanks. A song can be a prayer. Sometimes we just sit in His presence. We pray for our own needs, and sometimes for others.

God wants to hear all of these. Praying is a way for our heart to connect with God's heart. His deepest desire is for his children to know him and become more like him. When we spend time getting to know people the conversation becomes easier and more natural. In the same way, the more time we spend with God, the easier it is to have a conversation. So pull up a chair or a park bench with God. Talk to Him. Do it while you take a walk, or wash the dishes. He is waiting to hear from you.



CHI RHO

"Chi" and "rho" are the first two letters in the Greek spelling for Christ (XPICTOC. "Christos"). The pronounced blending of these two letters into a "sacred one symbol formed monogram." Early Christians created many such symbols as codes to indicate their discipleship while avoiding detection by Roman persecutors. Many variations of the Chi Rho symbol exist.
