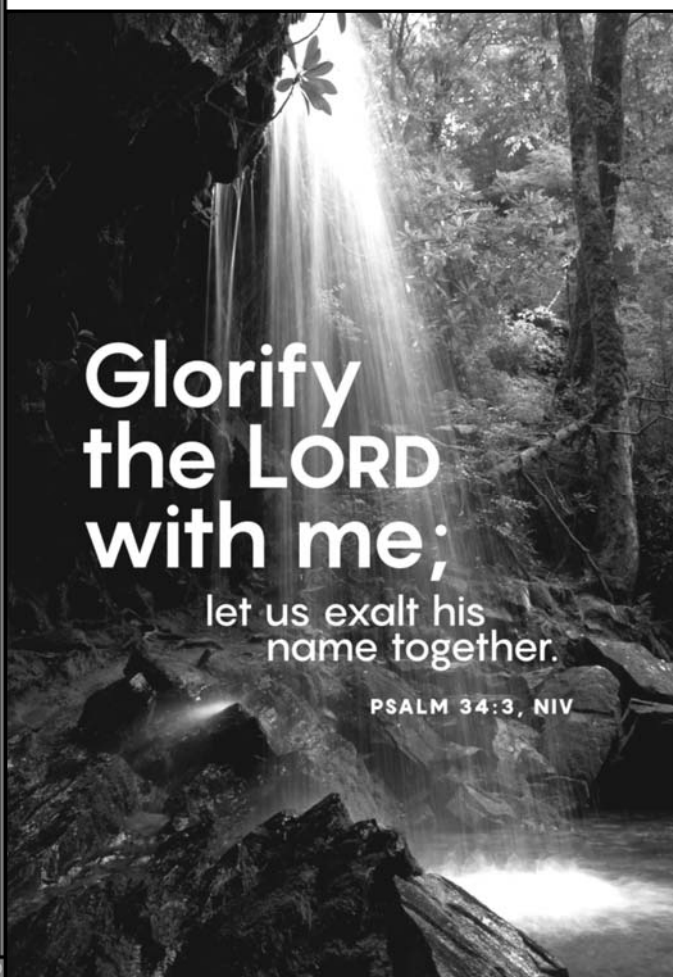

From The Pastor's Heart

According to the grace of God, which was given to me, like a wise master builder, I laid a foundation, and another is building on it. But each man must be careful how he builds on it.

1 Corinthians 3:10

This is a great time of the year as the changes of seasons are on us: a nip in the air after an amazing summer. As I look around the house I see many things that are on the “honey do list” which makes me feel like going to Lowes and getting ready to do some projects. I love their old slogan *“come and let’s build something together.”* I believe that is so often what is needed in our lives and the church. When we read or watch just five minutes of what’s happening in our world today, (devastation from hurricane Florence comes to all our minds) and many stories of broken lives, we know we are in real need of direction from the Master Builder. Our desire would be for God to guide us individually and together as we commit our hearts, lives, ministries and possessions under His care. We want to allow the Master Builder to have His way with our lives and future so that together we might reach the Collingswood community and beyond with his love and message of hope.

As the fall begins there are many new opportunities to grow in our relationship with Jesus and serve others too. There are many classes and small group experiences as well as serving and mission opportunities throughout the fall and winter for all ages. We have begun a new Sermon series on Sunday mornings on the importance of being a Connection people. We are calling our new series “Becoming a Lego Church.” Lego toys are built to



last so we can build amazing things with them. How can we make connections to become a “Lego” kind of people deeply connecting with one another, responding to the heart and prayer of Jesus of making disciples for His glory? I came across an article from Paul Brune that further helps us see the power of the master builder in our lives, Jesus Christ. May this encourage you as we journey with the Lord together this fall!

The Master Builder

The Lord reveals to me this big old mansion and while standing in full view remains at the same time hidden covered with years of dust and cob webs and in need of a Master Builders love whose skilful hands could only repair and restore it to its full beauty and grandeur.

The builder bought the mansion so he could do just that. As the builder opened the front doors and walked in and looked around only he could see what was beneath the years of reconstructed form work, the dust everywhere, the cob webs everywhere and the original furniture though covered over for protection from predators was still in place.

So the work began, first resetting the doors rightfully in place, oiling all the joints and then re-strengthening the posts and the floor boards; filling in the cracks on the stair well leading up to the front doors, replacing any broken windows and pruning back the under growth; the face then begins to reappear. With it, freedom to breathe and to be seen and while all this is going on the Master Builder has been working on the inside clearing the floor of debris starting at the centre of this grand old house; one room at a time setting all things in their proper place clearing away the dust dirt and cob webs while washing all the walls.

Ceiling, chandeliers, bathroom, and toilet, polishing everything as he goes he restores the kitchen filling it with the proper utensils; onward moves the Master Builder intent on a full and complete restoration of this mansion worthy of his whole attention and his time. He paid the price knowing that it would cost him his all and with eyes open fixed on the whole picture and the end result, spurred on by his knowledge, he continues his work.

He stands in the great hall looking up at the climb before him to the next level, each step in need of personal attention before reaching the top. Having a meticulous and intimate relationship with the detail of each step, he takes the time in his relationship to

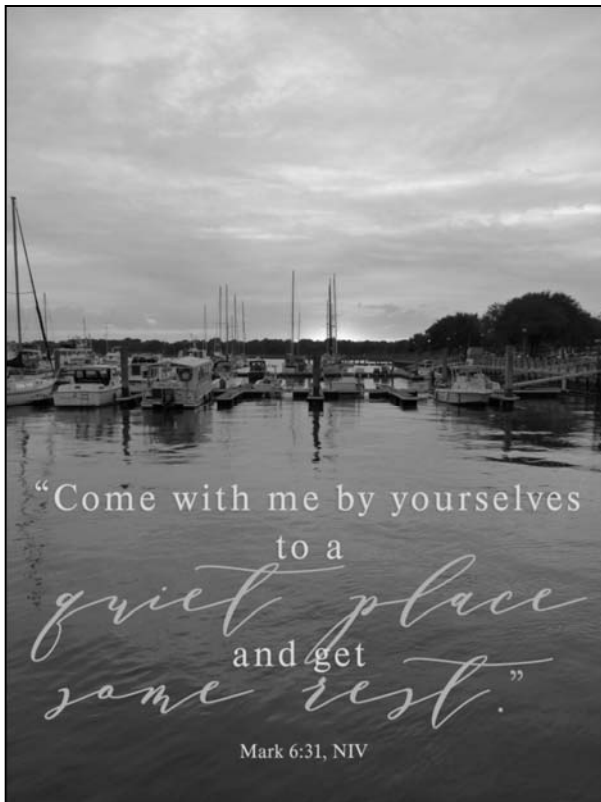

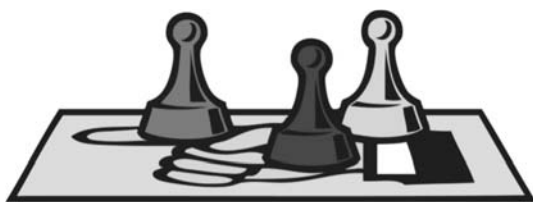

Don and Norma Toland, retired from Papua New Guinea

To All of Our Dear Prayer Partners:

Norma and I are sending this urgent prayer request, asking each of you to be in earnest prayer for the Rawa people of Papua New Guinea. After a Skype telephone conversation a couple of days ago with our Rawa Literacy Coordinator, Yunu [You-knew] Siwi, he told us of this very urgent prayer need.

For over a year now, very heavy Spiritual Warfare has been going on between some of the Rawa clans living across the mountain range in the Rawa Two dialect area. Yunu stated that in recent months this has spread across the mountain range to the communities in the Rawa One Dialect area as well. People are being hacked to death by machetes and their homes burned to the ground.

When we asked Yunu why these marauders were doing what they are going, he stated that no one seemed to know. Apparently, there is now a group of Rawa men that want to fight back by hacking the marauders up and burning them to death.

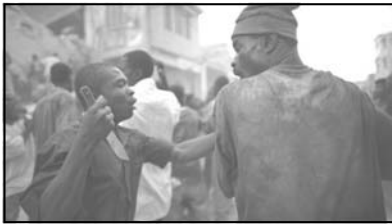
This has gotten so wide spread that a lot of the Rawa men have gotten so fearful for their lives, that they have either just fled along with their families, or have sent their wives and families out of

the Rawa area. Those who remain are fearful to even go to tend their food gardens.

Right now Satan is having a joyful celebration in seeing the Rawas systematically decimating one another. At this point, there is a dearth of strong Christian leadership to lead their people to follow the Lord.

Please pray with us that God will do battle for the Rawa people, and put a total stop to this senseless hatred and killing. Let's pray and claim the Lord's wall of protection surrounding all those who are following the Lord, so that the enemy can no longer hurt or kill them. Let's pray that when these evil marauders see the tremendous power of the Lord protecting His followers, that, in great fear, they will stop this senseless killing, repent, and turn to the Lord themselves. Thank you for standing with us in prayer about this most serious situation.

We received the following news from friends in Haiti working with Lemuel (Manis and Judy). I have changed and added some of the information. Many of you may be aware that there has been violent rioting and looting in Port-au-Prince for the past several days. The main incentive was a government announcement that gas prices were going to rise significantly. The riots began on Thursday, but escalated quickly over the weekend. Roads were cut off everywhere. Many businesses (including grocery stores) were burned and/or looted. Vehicles were burned or /smashed. Banks

were looted. The rioters would allow no vehicles on the roads, and most people sheltered in their homes....some of them couldn't even go out to buy food! (And most Haitians don't have refrigeration so they buy food day to day.) There were road blocks and demonstrations in other cities as well, but not to the level of Port-au-Prince.

Manis and Judy's Toyota Land Cruiser was in the city to buy supplies and the driver put it in the safest place he could: a supermarket (where we always shopped) parking lot that had security guards. But, security guards can't do anything in the face of a mob. The supermarket was looted, and the Land Rover was smashed and looted as well.

The decision about gas price hikes was rescinded, but the mobs were then saying they will not stop until the current president, Jovenel Moise, steps down. However, as of now, it appears that police are trying to restore order. Some main roads are still blocked, and there may be isolated demonstrations still going on. But, vehicles have cautiously begun to circulate in Port-au-Prince. We are not sure what the coming days will look like; things are still tense. Moreover, there have been a lot of losses that may affect everyone in a secondary way.

The staff of Lemuel are all safe as well as our friends and family. Some of our missionary family are in the states now so they are away from the violence.

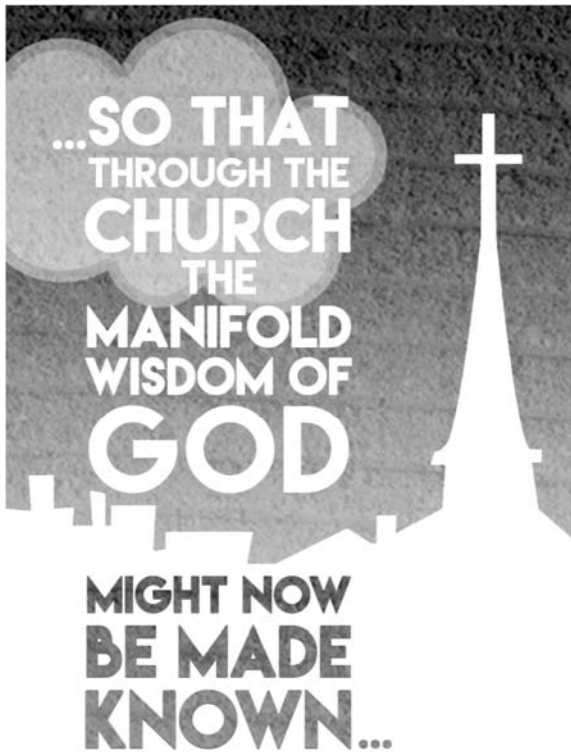
Please pray for Haiti at this time. Pray that believers will truly be a living light--agents of God's love, peace, justice and wisdom in the middle of a lot of chaos. Long term, you can pray for an end to government corruption; for wise and righteous leaders; for a change in mentality to one of unity and understanding; for stability and peace.

Neil and Wannee Thompson, Thailand

Our OMF-US National Conference last week was a great blessing and very inspiring. The theme was "From Strength to Strength." Several international leaders attended, as well as our National Director Elect, James (with Lisa) Dougherty—a guy who, fresh out of college started at the office the same day as I, in August 2001! Our home staff from across the country, missionaries on home assignment, board members and other volunteers, many retirees and ministry partners attended. We learned that I am one of 77 retirees in the US; nine are over 90 years old! We have served a cumulative 2667 years in East Asia—and many more since returning to the US!

The Field Updates were very moving, primarily from Vietnam and The Philippines. We were thrilled to reunite with old friends from Thailand and young friends who became missionaries during our term in leadership. I spent a breakfast with an anesthesiologist who is considering early retirement to serve in East Asia! Please pray for all who attended and for enhanced understanding of OMF ministry by volunteers and partners.

Please pray for our ministry at The Pines: providing a welcoming, relaxing and spiritually and physically refreshing environment in Thailand. Wannee will manage the accounts, schedule reservations and oversee the Thai staff. She asks for special prayer in working with the Thai staff—both in maintaining good working relationships and times to share about the Lord. I will lead our Sunday morning and worship services (sharing insights from Romans.) One of the Thai staff—Joe—a is a handyman, providing general maintenance and fixing what goes wrong. Pray for me as I work with him and look for opportunities to share the Gospel.

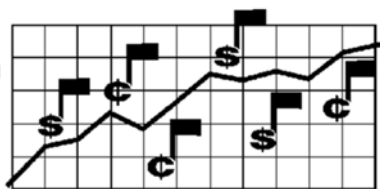

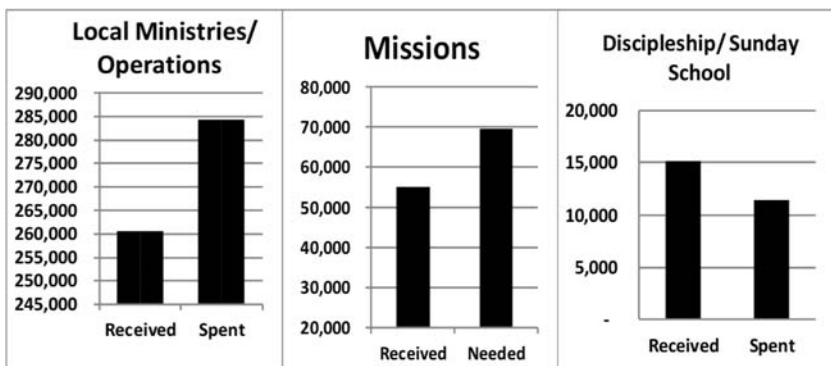

Financial Notes



August 2018 FIRST CHURCH FINANCIAL REPORT - We appreciate your consistent, generous giving as we build the kingdom together. Finances through August were as follows:



Local ministries/operations Account - This account supports our church's personnel, property, program and administrative expenses and the Greater NJ Annual Conference shared ministries. The 2018 local ministries/operations budget is \$464,763. It is funded by 90% of the 90%/10% local ministries/operation-missions offerings, 100% of the local ministries/operations offerings, 90% of loose plate offerings, conference apportionment-world service offerings and miscellaneous income.

Missions Account - This account supports First Church-related missionaries, First Church-related ministries and other missionaries and ministries. The 2018 missions budget is \$104,288 or \$8,691/month. It is funded by a 10% tithe of the 90%/10% local ministries-operations/missions offerings, missions offerings, 10% of loose plate offerings and the Easter and Christmas missions offerings.

Discipleship / Sunday School Account - This account supports the Sunday School, Vacation Bible School and certain youth expenses. The 2018 Sunday School/Discipleship budget is \$17,000. It is funded by offerings given in Sunday School classes and by offerings to the church designated for Sunday School/Discipleship, Vacation Bible School and youth.

Designated Funds - In addition to their support of the local ministries/operations, mission and Sunday school/discipleship budgets, members and friends of First Church gave \$1,755 as follows to designated funds during August:

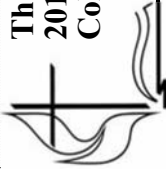
- \$1,265 in memorial gifts
- \$333 for the Sunday school, VBS and youth programs. These funds have been transferred to the Sunday school treasurer and are in addition to offerings taken in Sunday School classes. They will be reflected in the Sunday school/discipleship portion of the September 2018 First Church Financial Report.
- \$137 for the Local Benevolence fund. These funds have been transferred to the Benevolence treasurer.
- \$20 for the Grace Café.

Consistent support of our local ministries/operations, missions and Sunday School / Discipleship ministries by members and friends of First Church enables us to do all we do. Thank you. We report finances to the congregation each month.

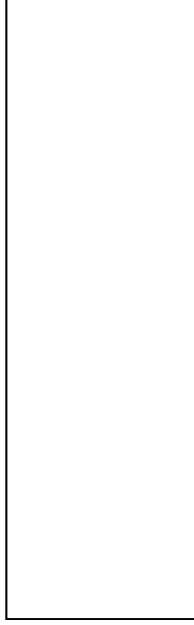
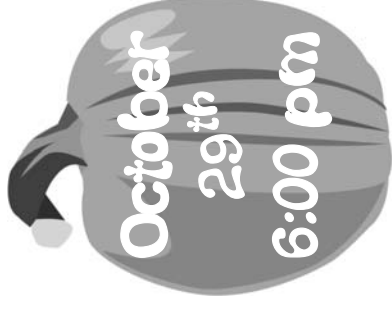
