

From The Pastor's Heart



Summer will be here before you know it and lots of plans are being made, some for picnics, days in the mountains or at the beach. Many people look for some well-deserved rest and relaxation because if we are truly honest, all too often, the margins of life can quickly disappear in the midst of busy and hectic paces of life. However, the one thing we know about life is we never know what it can hold from day to day! We must live our lives trusting God, knowing we need His guidance and care every step of the way.

Apostle Paul says it clearly in a letter to the church when he wrote for God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," may his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ. But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us. 2 Corinthians 4:6-7

Recently, I read about Tammie Jo Shults' story told by Dr. Jim Denison who is now the famous pilot who landed Flight 1380 after an engine exploded in the air. She guided the plane down after a twenty-thousand-foot drop in six minutes, then walked down the aisle hugging passengers. Passengers described her as having "nerves of steel" and being a "true American hero." What you may not know is that she is also a committed Christian.

Tammie Jo has led the children's worship program at First Baptist Church of Boerne, Texas. She has also taught Sunday school for children, middle schoolers, high schoolers, and adults. According to Staci Thompson, a longtime friend and church staff member, the congregation was "impressed" but not "shocked" at Shults's heroics.

Her courage under fire comes from her training: three decades ago, She became one of the first female fighter pilots in the US military. But even more, it comes from her Lord. Thompson says her friend "wants people to know that God was there with her" on Flight 1380 and "that he helped her in getting control of that plane

and landing that plane."


"It was because of him, not her," Thompson said. "She was just a teammate and a co-captain. He was the captain." God's grace was the source of her strength. Her greatest mission in life is to live out Jesus' love on a daily basis.

How do we live out Jesus' love today? "We all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit" (2 Corinthians 3:18). "Behold the glory of the Lord today in worship, prayer, and intimate communion with your the Lord. Know that his Spirit will transform you into the image of his Son." (Romans 8:29) You then will be able to show the world Jesus' love, compassion, mercy, and grace in your life, too!

Abraham Kuyper was a brilliant theologian who also served as prime minister of the Netherlands. He observed: "No service in itself is small / none great, though earth it fill / But that is small that seeks its own / And great that does God's will." What a wonderful thing it is to be spiritually renewed. May it be on our summer must do list this year!



Larry and Fay Buckman, South America

After our last training with indigenous missionaries, I started a WhatsApp page with all the students and other ministries in Brazil. In just a few weeks we are watching their world as each crisis sends us to our knees. Paulo Nunes just sent a message from a conference he is directing in Cacoal, at least a thousand miles from

his home in Manaus. Technology is helping us carry the burdens for others.

Paulo writes: "My brothers and sisters it is with heavy heart that I beg for your prayers in favor of the Yanomami people in Ninan, Roriama State. (Near the Venezuelan border)

This is our request that you pray for the Yanomami people in Ninam. Our indigenous co-worker, Gilberto, part of our Bible translation team who graduated from AMI, the South American Mission Bible School, was assassinated Saturday to Sunday in Pewa -u. We do not know the details yet...especially how this will affect our Jesus Film work. Gilberto was the voice of Jesus on the film dubbing. PLEASE PRAY WITH US. Gilberto left a wife and three children.

The assassin is the health agent for the village of Santana. There was another assassination in a village nearby when a son stabbed his father who died. This could mean for the Yanomami a sign of war and vengeance. We beg for your prayers.

Gilberto Yanomami Ninan was our colleague and this could have a perverse retaliation between the communities where we work. The devil is furious because the Light of Jesus is shining in the midst of those people. This is a spiritual warfare.

Brothers we had just completed building Gilberto a house for his family as our missionary aid to him. We just completed that house."



The WhatsApp page is alive with responses from so many of our students and leaders. You can see the traffic if you log onto "Ondas Unidas Brasil" and at least look at the pictures. People are


The job I love is now a "win-win!"


More fun jobs I am now working on:

Wings of Prayer



I've been thinking about the Psalms. Some of them, like Psalm 23, are so comforting. God is our Shepherd, our Caregiver, who leads us, protects us and brings us to a good place. Some Psalms, like Psalm 8, help us worship as we think of how great, how awesome our God is. Some Psalms, though, reflect our


confusion, pain, and questions. The phrase "how long?" appears in several Psalms. When will this struggle end? When will God heal?

One of the things I appreciate about the book of Psalms – a book of prayers and songs – is how the psalms reflect the heart of the writers. They're real. Like life, they are not all sunshine and mountaintop experiences. Oh, there are certainly those feelings and expressions in there! But there are also cries of anger, despair, fear and anguish. They're prayers and songs of real people. And all of them are addressed to the One who created and loves real people.

God loves to hear from us; He loves to engage us in dialogue ~ in prayer. He enjoys our praise and worship. There's an older praise song with these words: "You are beautiful beyond description. Too marvelous for words. Too wonderful for comprehension, like nothing ever seen or heard. Who can match your infinite wisdom? Who can fathom the depth of your love? ... And I stand, I stand, in awe of you. Lord I stand, I stand in awe of you. Holy God to whom all praise is due, I stand in awe of you!" There are times when we want to shout about God's beauty, majesty, holiness, righteousness and power.

There are also times we want to talk with God about our hurt, suffering, questions and uncertainty. He knows we are limited, angry, confused, impatient and full of a host of other human frailties. God wants to hear these things from us. He wants us to bring our joys and our sorrows, our mountaintop experiences and our deep valley situations to him. Nothing is too large or too small to bring to God in prayer.

What is on your mind right now? What do you want to say to God? What counsel, comfort or relief do you need? Our Father wants to hear from you! Join me in prayers of praise and thanksgiving as well as petitions for our concerns and those of the people around us. 
