

From The Pastor's Heart

What a tremendous spring we are now having. The day light is longer, the air starting to get warmer, the grass is growing, and flowers are blooming. Baseball has begun. Even though the Phillies will not be competing for the World Series this year, it is still baseball. All in all the promise of spring and summer is here! (Compared to our long cold winter).

There is nothing quite like being in the presence of something truly special! On Good Friday morning my heart was stirred by God's presence watching 450 plus men celebrating what's "Good" about Good Friday. We had the privilege to listen to Stefen Wisniewski from the Philadelphia Eagles share his journey of how God's love and spirit changed his life and can do the same for us. How moving it was for men across from our church family and across our region to hear how God can use anyone that's willing to give themselves back to him as Stefen reminded us on that morning.

On May 20th we will be celebrating "Pentecost," the birthday of the church. We'll remember when some 2000 years ago 120 people were waiting on the Holy Spirit of God. The impact was life changing! As Luke records in the book of Acts 1:8 "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." There was something truly amazing when the presence of the Holy Spirit infused the early disciples and followers. Their journey took them on a whole new adventure because the presence of God was now in them and in their midst.

The power of God's presence and our presence has been on my mind a lot lately. I read an article a while back by David Graves that also shared these sentiments that have challenged me every time I read it...

I was once again reminded of the power of presence. Presence is a noun, not a verb; it is a state of being, not doing. The state of being is not highly valued in a culture that places high priority on doing. Yet, true presence or "being with" another person carries with it a silent power—power to bear witness to a passage,

to help carry an emotional burden, or to begin a healing process. In it, there is an intimate connection with another person that is perhaps felt too seldom in a society that strives for ever-faster and broader "connectivity."

As a pastor, I learned that just "being there," being present, can mean the world to people, especially in their times of need. The power of one's presence, not one's words or wisdom, is what people will remember. The impact of being present with people not only conveys God's love for them, but it is also a blessing to the one who is simply being present.

The power of presence is not a one-way street, not just something we give to others. It always changes us, and for the better. It can positively affect our everyday living that spills out into our prayer life, our compassion for others, and our connection with people. This power of presence is not only for the people of our congregations; it is also for our families and our neighbors and those we have around us. Intentionally setting aside time to be with one's wife, children, and grandchildren to read a book, play a game, and listen to their stories communicates love. In those moments, the importance is not necessarily what we say or do, but that we are really there. We all know there are moments of action and trailblazing and preparedness that children desperately need from their father or mother. However, I believe there are just as many



moments when they long for a power from us that comes primarily from our presence, humbling ourselves, like Christ, our example, and entering their worlds.

In our culture today many of us can get so busy "doing" that we miss the power of "being present." As we allow the Spirit of God to be present in our lives it is surprising how that very same presence can lead us into making an eternal difference in other's lives too! Let's go make a difference!



Vacation Bible School

June 25th - 29th 9:30 AM - 12:30 PM Volunteer Job Descriptions

Decorating Team: Using the decorating guide and provided resources, help decorate multiple VBS team centers and classrooms.

Prayer Team: Meet before and during the week of VBS to pray for all children, families, leaders, and helpers participating.

Greeter/Registration: Be a friendly face that assists parents and children in registering and locating classes/centers.

Bible Story Drama Team: Help teach the Bible story through drama as each group of children visits the Bible Story Center.

Small Group Team: After each age group visits the Bible Story Center lead small groups of students using the life application questions to help students learn and apply the daily life point. Participation in a special training session is required.

Recreation Team: Help gather and prepare game supplies. Lead children in playing the active games.

Craft Team: Help prepare the materials for the selected crafts. Explain and supervise the crafts as each group of children visits the Craft Center.

Snack Team: Using the Snack Center Guide lead children to create their daily snack which reteaches the daily Bible story theme.

Memory Verse Team: At the music/memory verse center use games from the planning materials to lead students to memorize the daily Bible verse. Gather materials and prepare the daily games.

Music Team: Teach children songs and motions.

Missions Team: Use video resources and materials to introduce children to 2 missionary families.

Classroom Teacher - 3, 4 & 5 Year Olds and Kindergarten: Use resources to teach Bible stories, crafts, etc. to children.

Classroom Helper - 3, 4 & 5 Year Olds: Assist classroom teacher as needed. For example, help with Bible story, crafts, & games.

Age Group Guides for Grades $1^{st} - 6^{th}$ Grade: Escort a group of students to the different activity centers. Be prepared to talk to

students about the daily Bible story & verse.

Travel Buddy: Travel with and assist students with additional needs.

Nursery Team: Teach and care for children ages birth up to three years old of the VBS volunteers.

Run Laptop: Operate the laptop during the opening, the Bible Story Center sessions (if needed), and closing assemblies – playing video clips and music videos.

Run Sound System: Operate the sound system in the Sanctuary for opening and closing assemblies and also for the Bible Story Center sessions.

Photographer/Videographer: Photograph and/or video specific segments of VBS. Compile photos and/or videos for the closing program and Celebration Sunday.

Clean Up Team: After VBS concludes on Friday remove all decorations from classes/centers and prepare the building for the Sunday Celebration. After the Sunday Celebration and picnic remove all set decorations from the Sanctuary.

Sunday Celebration Picnic Team – July 1st 12:00 pm: Set-up, prepare, serve, and/or clean-up after the Celebration Picnic.

Help with Follow-up Mailing: Work with Children's Director to send a "thank you" follow-up letter to all participating families.

Please pray about where you can volunteer.

Please Note: For the safety of all our children, all persons who work with VBS children **must** attend one Vacation Bible School training session and must be Safe Sanctuary background checked. Please see Pat Gunning for a Safe Sanctuary background check form.

The Lord has been showing me that mission work doesn't belong to us, it is His. He uses the combined spiritual efforts of many people to accomplish His purposes. Looking back, I can see people He used in my life.

Two recent deaths remind me how God used these two people to bless me. My mother was expecting me when she went forward in a Billy Graham ministry rally. (Billy Graham wasn't there.) When she made her commitment to the Lord it meant I was born into a Christian home. Years later I accepted Christ at the feet of my mother. God used Billy Graham's ministry to bring my mother to Christ. That changed the direction of my life. I add my testimony to millions of others, paying grateful respect to this man of faith.

At nineteen, after spending years using ham radio in Lansing, IL speaking with missionaries, I made my first trip to the Congo. That summer, I traveled and lived with my cousin John Enright. John and I were both the same age and freshmen in college. John was returning home to his missionary parents, Ken and Lorraine Enright, for summer break. We spent most of the summer at a remote outpost called Lake Kafakumba. As two teenage boys, we hunted and had wild adventures. John was the person that introduced me to Africa. His love of Africa was contagious. God used that summer to call me to be a missionary. Africa became my future.

John and his wife, Kendra, and Claudia and I spent twelve years working together in the small town of Luena, Zaire. We lived one block apart. As new missionaries, they helped us learn the ropes. John and I were both pilots in the *Wings of the Morning* flight ministry. John was in charge of church construction and I was the radio technician. Both of us got involved in a great many different projects as well.

In 1991, when anarchy and looting occurred in Zaire, John, missionary pilot, Kenny Vance, and I evacuated many missionaries and Peace Corp to Zambia. The Enrights and Vances settled in Zambia to continue their ministries. Claudia and I went to Tanzania to continue the ministry we started there just before the looting.

In December I received news that John had been killed in a

road accident in Zambia when a truck struck the Enright's vehicle. John was killed instantly. Kendra was seriously injured. We pray for her full recovery. We were all shocked by this tragedy. I thank God for all John Enright meant to me. John loved agriculture, was brilliant and charismatic.

Death reminds us we have been given the privilege of investing ourselves - right now - in what matters for eternity. Thank you Billy. Thank you John. Thank you for all you did for me. Thank you for all you mean to me.

NOTE: John Enright was the son of Ken and Lorraine Enright, longtime supported missionaries of FUMC.

MARCH 2018 FIRST CHURCH FINANCIAL REPORT - We appreciate your consistent, generous giving as we build the kingdom together. Finances through March were as follows:







Local Ministries/Operations Account - This account supports our church's personnel, property, program and administrative expenses

and the Greater NJ Annual Conference shared ministries. The 2018 local ministries/operations budget is \$464,763. It is funded by 90% of the 90%/10% local ministries/operation-missions offerings, 100% of the local ministries/operations offerings, 90% of loose plate offerings, conference apportionment-world service offerings and miscellaneous income.

Missions Account - This account supports First Church-related missionaries, First Church-related ministries and other missionaries and ministries. The 2018 missions budget is \$104,288 or \$8,691/month. It is funded by a 10% tithe of the 90%/10% local ministries-operations/missions offerings, missions offerings, 10% of loose plate offerings and the Easter and Christmas missions offerings.

Discipleship / Sunday School Account - This account supports the Sunday School, Vacation Bible School and certain youth expenses. The 2018 Sunday School / Discipleship budget is \$17,000. It is funded by offerings given in Sunday School classes and by offerings to the church designated for Sunday School/Discipleship, Vacation Bible School and youth.

Consistent support of our Local Ministries-Operations, Missions and Sunday School / Discipleship ministries by members and friends of First Church enables us to do all we do. Thank you. We report finances to the congregation each month.
