Still on Mission!

I still find myself amazed at how this church focuses on its mission. even with so many distractions all around! Our call is to love others enough to get up, stand up, speak up and walk up for what we believe in because the one we imitate loved us enough to get up from his seat by the Father, stand up to Satan, speak up for truth against his deception, and then walk up that hill to die on a cross for our sins and the sins of this world.

Because He came to love, serve and sacrifice for us, we live to love, serve and sacrifice and there is no issue that we won't approach without bringing that mission into how we address, or don't address, an issue. We will not always choose the right course of action, we may make mistakes and miscommunicate, we may act without enough information, and we may decide to act or not act with horrible timing; but the thing we will not do, is act without considering our mission, to continue the mission of our Savior to love, serve and sacrifice.

Brothers and Sisters, I am proud of you! You remind me over and over that God is working through us to be the living love of Jesus in our world as His Body, His Church. You are making a difference, a difference now and for eternity!

The mission committee is amazed and grateful for your generous contributions for purchasing food in Zimbabwe! So far, \$10,276 has been given, with several more donations promised. The mission committee is allocating an additional \$3,000 from our budget. The plan is to provide food for orphans, disabled, elderly, single parent families, and other destitute families in Chinhoyi and Ruwangwe. These are the two areas where Graham Street is supporting evangelists. The brethren in each area are forming a team to identify the needy and formulate a plan for distributing the food. If possible, food will be distributed two or three times. Depending on prices, 300-400 families may be fed each time. More definitive plans should be ready next week, with the first food distribution to follow shortly. Please keep Zimbabwe in your prayers.

BASIC NEEDS RE-OPENING PLANS

Basic Needs will operate one more Thursday (June 11) using the drive through food distribution method at the Family Center. The following Thursday (June 18) food will be distributed at the Basic Needs Store using a 6ft distancing method. This method of food distribution will continue until the 6ft separation restraints are lifted. Only 1 person per family will be allowed in the pantry (with the exception of handicapped individuals needing assistance). However, clothing will not be distributed at the Store, our clients will be able to get needed clothing and household items at the Family Center after receiving a ticket to do so from the store beginning July 2. This means we need to move clothing from Basic Needs to the Family Center, which will happen Monday afternoon (June 8). So, volunteers and pickups are needed to transport the clothing and set it up in the Family Center. The Basic Needs Workroom reopens June 15. Food distribution from the Store begins June 18; and Clothing distribution from the Family Center begins July 2. This method of distribution will continue until we no longer need to practice social distancing.
