

LESSON 3: JUDGES: GOD SENDS DEBORAH TO HELP BARAK CRAFT: WISE OWL SOCKS

SUPPLIES

- Sock
- Owl Instructions
- Stuffing material, such as fiberfill, newspaper, packing peanuts, or cotton balls
- ¾-inch googly eyes
- Glue dots
- Craft feathers
- Black felt
- Yellow or orange felt
- · Yellow or orange chenille wires
- Scissors
- Yarn
- · empty water bottle



Make an Owl

We're learning that <u>God gives us wisdom</u>. People often think of owls as wise, so let's make owls to remind us of wisdom.

- Cut off the bottom of the sock at the heel. You'll use only the bottom part of the sock.
- If you want the owl to be able to stand up, cut a water bottle in half and put the bottom half in the sock. This will give it a flat bottom.
- Fill the sock with stuffing material. (If using newspaper, crumple it first.)
- Tie yarn around the opening in the sock to secure the stuffing. Trim off any excess sock or yarn.
- Tie yarn about a third of the way down the sock, tightening it to make a neck.
- Cover the body of the sock with craft feathers, using Glue Dots to adhere the feathers.
- Use Glue Dots to place eyes on the face of the owl.
- Cut a triangle out of yellow or orange felt and adhere it under the eyes as a beak.

Add a Graduation Cap and Feet

- Cut a square out of black felt. The square should be about the size of the owl's head.
- Cut a strip of black felt, about a half inch wide. Curve the strip into a circle that fits under the square.
- Use Glue Dots to adhere the ends of the strip together and to attach the circle to the square.
- Make a tassel using yarn, and use a Glue Dot to attach it to the top of the graduation cap.
- To make feet, cut two pieces of chenille wire about 2 or 3 inches long.
- Bend a 6-inch piece of chenille wire to make a right angle.
- Wind the smaller chenille wire strips around the ends of the longer piece so you have two feet with three talons each.
- Secure the feet to the bottom of the owl with Glue Dots.

Talk About It

Why do you think people consider owls to be wise? What characteristics make a *person* seem wise?

We know Deborah was wise because she could hear God's messages and give advice to people with problems. <u>God gives us wisdom</u>, too. When we don't know what to do, we know just whoooo we can turn to!
