American artist James Whistler (1834-1903) was born in Lowell, Mass. He is best remembered for his portrait Whistler's Mother.

The U.S. State Department issues the first passport July 7, 1898

Margarine is patented July 15, 1869

Some Interesting Facts continued:

July 19, 1799: French soldier discovers Rosetta Stone. A Napoleonic soldier found a black stone outside Rosetta, a town 35 miles from Alexandria. The stone was a slab, almost $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet wide and nearly 4 feet long with different inscriptions on it including Egyptian demotic, Greek and Egyptian hieroglyphics. Napoleon ordered a group of scholars to seize any cultural artefacts and to take them into French possession. The British took ownership of the stone after defeating the French in 1801.

July 6, 1885: French microbiologist Louis Pasteur successfully gave the first anti-rabies vaccination to 9 year old Joseph Meister who had been bitten by a dog. Pasteur, who had first tested the rabies vaccine on dogs, was a pioneer in using vaccines to prevent the spread of infectious diseases.

July 24, 1943: Following the German bombing raids on the British home front during the 2nd World War the British and American Air Forces retaliated by bombing Hamburg.

Out of 791 British aircrafts that took part in Operation Gomorrah, only 12 were lost as the Air Force began to drop strips of aluminum foil out of the planes, which blocked the German radars and allowed the majority of the bombers to continue with their planned route.

July 20, 1969: After Apollo 11's launch on July 16, watched by an estimated television audience of 530 million, even more tuned in as astronaut Neil Armstrong took the first ever step on the moon.

As he put down his foot on the moon's surface, television viewers heard Armstrong announce: "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind". However, Armstrong is reported to have said that he has been misquoted, and that he in fact said: "That's one small step for a man..."

July 7, 1898-President William McKinley signed a resolution annexing Hawaii. In 1900, Congress made Hawaii an incorporated territory of the U.S., which it remained until becoming a state in 1959.

July 8, 1776— The first public reading of the Declaration of Independence occurred as Colonel John Nixon read it to an assembled crowd in Philadelphia.

July 2, 1881– President James A. Garfield was shot and mortally wounded as he entered a railway station in Washington, D.C. He died on September 19th

July 4, 1882— The "Last Great Buffalo Hunt" began on Indian reservation lands near Hettinger, North Dakota as 2,000 Teton Sioux Indians in full hunting regalia killed about 5,000 buffalo. By this time, most of the estimated 6075 million buffalo in America had been killed by white hunters who usually took the hides and left the meat to rot. By 1883, the last of the free-ranging buffalo were gone.
