Come to me all you who labour and are heavily burdened

In the seventh month of the year 445 B.C. Ezra the scribe read from the Law as the people of Israel returned to worship at the temple after their long years of exile. There was great merrymaking and they feasted for seven days (Nehemiah 8). The biblical account gives a real sense of occasion and of the joy of being back home at last.

In the Gospel for the 14th Sunday of the Year we hear Jesus speak his words of invitation, "Come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest. Shoulder my yoke and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls."

After our period of exile from Mass and while we still carry our wounds and burdens I am pleased to be able to invite you to the celebration of the Eucharist - the Mass, the memorial of the Lord's passion, and the foretaste and promise of the Feast of Heaven. The last few months have been quite a shock to the system for many of us, and it may take time to get used to coming to Mass again, but it is especially there that we will find the Lord's healing and strength.

Public Masses This weekend we are pleased to be able to gather again for Mass, and after a long absence it will naturally take a while to adjust to being back, and to the more simpler form of celebration that we need to observe in these early days.

- **Mass won't be at the usual times, so please check.**
- We will observe **2m distancing** of seating rather than 1m+, at least to begin with. This will give us capacity for between 12 households at St Edmund's and 10 households (16 couples) at St Joseph's.

- We will **clean the church** after each use.
- We will continue with a Sunday Liturgy of the Word **online**.

In other times I would introduce it at our Sunday Masses, but given the constraints of the present age, I have shared it, commend it for your prayer and reflection and invite any questions you might have or comments you would like to make. It is still work in progress and there will be an important next stage which prioritises its various elements. I am grateful to those who have commented on earlier drafts of this document, and helped me to refine it, but any errors and omissions are mine.

I would like to thank the DR team - Alan, Jo, Sheena, Adrian, and Sarah for the way they have supported the growth and development of the parish under Fr David and in my first six months here and for their continuing friendship and wise counsel. They have rightly encouraged me to seek to build a new team which can help steer the parish in its next phase and I will try to do this over the coming months as we ease back into more regular parish life.

Many of you will know that Alan Lion has stepped back from leading the DR team and F&GP, and I would like to record in particular my gratitude and admiration for his faith-filled leadership and service to the parish over recent years. It has helped us to become more conscious of the imperative of mission, and that there is much more work to do.
