A Note From The Pastor July 2020

It is hard to believe that we are in July! The year is half over. For some summer is half over. When Gale was teaching she would get grouchy around the 4^{th} of July. It wasn't that she disliked the 4^{th} of July or all of the celebration that accompanies it. As a matter of fact, she enjoys the 4^{th} of July celebrations. The 4^{th} of July is a big celebration time for all of our family. She really likes summer and the warm weather. If it wasn't for me being in the house, she probably would seldom use the air-conditioning. For her the 4^{th} of July was a reminder that soon she would be back in a classroom. Her days of tending her flowers and setting on the deck admiring them were about to pass. Now school starts even sooner. Our grandkids in Brownsburg start on July 31 and the grandkids in Southport start the day before.

The first half of this year held a lot, I think too much, stress on everyone of us, our church, the country, and the world. Our winter attendance was better than the past few years. We formed a youth group in the fall and it was flourishing. Our ministries were touching a lot of lives. We were growing in a lot of ways. Then we had to close our doors, stop the youth group, and shut off the ministries. I was seriously concerned how we would fare through it all. I wondered how much of a church we would have when it was all over? I prayed, you all prayed, and our prayers were answered. We are open for worship for all who want to come in. Our ministries are restarting. Children's church starts again in a couple of weeks. And, even more amazing, we are growing in other ways. We are able to minister to our folks in their homes. We are reaching people we would never have reached before. We started the Facebook Live broadcasts to make the service available to those in our church. We had no idea the impact it would have on others. Through the Facebook Live broadcasts we are reaching people all around the community and the country. We have an average of 135 views per week and a high of 175 views two weeks ago. The midweek chat is averaging 62 per week. God used our meager efforts and made it something much bigger. We even obtained a \$5000 grant to buy equipment to produce the Facebook and YouTube broadcasts more professionally. We are already in preliminary talks with a company to acquire, install, and train us in this endeavor. Thanks to Billie Sue for alerting us to the grant and Mark Spellbring for his work applying and pursuing the grant.

As the second half of the year evolves I want you to think about a few things. First, are there other ways God can use our church? Is God speaking to you about a ministry, a program, ways to make our church better in any way? Every ministry and service we provide has come from God speaking to one of you. Secondly, as we open more of the church and more folks start coming to the worship services there are going to be some who are not ready.

I am a firm believer in free will. As we consider what we need to do and when that time is right for us, we need to be accepting of others that think differently than how we may understand it. The New Testament speaks many times about even when YOU believe something is okay and others are not at the same point as you, put their needs first and don't judge where they are in the process. Third, if you are not ready to come in yet, do not neglect to worship. Join the service live on Facebook. Watch it later on Facebook or YouTube. If you need something let me or one of your brothers or sisters know. Fourth, keep praying for the church, the shut ins, the Ad Council, all of the members of our church, me, our community, and our nation.

I think God has good things in store for us in the second half of this year. Always remember, whether you are inside or outside; this is still your church, we are still family, God is still your God, the Father is still in control, Christ is still our Savior, the Holy Spirit is still working among us, and these things will not change until Jesus comes to take us home!!!





A bean supper will be held on Tuesday evening in the church hall. Music will follow.


