A Note From The Pastor June 2020

COVID-19. It is a word I have come to dislike. Because of what it does to people. Not just what it does medically, but everything it does to all of us. There is not a person in this country who has not been slapped in the face by COVID-19. It effects where we go, what we do, how we live, and for some, if we live. People have lost their jobs, companies have gone bankrupt, small businesses have been devastated. Families have been locked out of hospitals and funeral homes when someone they love is inside. I've seen children and grandchildren cry because they could not go in and say goodbye to the one they loved and then could not have a "proper" funeral. And when people need spiritual support, churches and other houses of worship are closed.

We have done everything we can to try to keep "church" going. Facebook Live, YouTube, calls, prayers, and now drive-in church. Sometimes it has gone well, sometimes not so well. But we have worked hard to try to keep a way to worship available to everyone.

I miss having "church" in the church. I miss seeing you all. Shaking hands and smiling faces are vital parts of our congregational experiences. I am more than ready to have services back in the church, but I remind myself it is not about me. I always think back to the principles Jesus taught that Steve Waltz reminded us to follow; being your brother's keeper, placing others ahead of yourself, being a servant to those around us.

When the Ad Council meets, we start by praying for guidance, (every meeting not just now) and try to discern the will of God in all we do. At times that is easy, at times it is exceedingly difficult. That is why I have asked for you to pray for us too. We have met by conference calls, video conferencing, and twice in the fellowship hall spread all over the room with masks and wide social distancing. We examine the latest information that is available from many including medical and scientific sources, governmental sources, our denominational Bishop and Superintendent, and anything else we can find. All the way back in March we ordered masks and automated hand sanitizers which were, of course, back ordered. They are supposed to be here this week.

Not only is there a need to gather for worship, we have ministries to conduct. People still, or maybe more than ever, need food, clothing, fellowship, support, and all the other ministries our congregation provides. We talked about the ramifications around our ministries also.

The mission of the Ad Council is not to run the church, our mission is to serve the church. We do not take our decisions lightly. We met last Monday to decide the next week. We started with considering having church in the sanctuary this week. When we considered all the ramifications it was decided to wait at least one more week. There where some of us (and some of you) that are ready to be in the church, there are some who want to wait several weeks, there are some who don't know what to do. If we have church and only 8 or 10 show up? What if 50 show up and with social distancing we don't have room? Can we hold church with no one singing or reading in unison? We understand everyone has personal responsibility and free will. We understand our risks, can make our choices and live with our consequences. However, others may have to live with our consequences. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, had 3 Simple Rules for Christian living. The first on is "Do no Harm." In the end we all felt it was best to do drive-in church one more week. To me this was a sign we were following the guidance of the Holy Spirit because we were all in "one accord."

One thing we realized we were missing. Although I have asked every week for input, we have received little from you all. Rob Belcher put together a survey so we can find out what YOU all want. We don't want to be guided by a few and find out the many have different wishes. Please fill out the survey so we can know everyone's wishes and make the best decisions. You may not think we made the right decisions. Some may think we are moving too slow, or too fast. We are doing our best. Please accept whatever decisions that are made as decisions made in everyone's best interest and most importantly decisions that are trying to follow the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Our desire is to be back in the church as soon as we can be, but not sooner than we should be. Keep praying for us as we keep trying to do the will of God and what is best for ALL of you.

I love you all and I miss you all! I will be glad when I see you in the Sanctuary.




"What have you got there, dear?" his mother asked."






