A Note from the Pastor May 2020

It does not seem like we are heading into May. Without a Palm Sunday and Good Friday service it did not seem like Holy Week. Seeing the kids decorate with the palms last year was such a delight and I was really looking forward to that time of celebration. Even though we did a broadcast from the church for a Maundy Thursday/Last Supper remembrance and Good Friday, without people in the pews it just wasn't the same. There is just something special about sharing communion during one of those services and we miss that communion with God and each other. We need to stay home as long as we should, and get back together as soon as we can. A couple of days ago the Bishop Trimble advised us not to gather until at least May 17. We have ordered masks and hand sanitizer stations for the church. I'm not sure if they will arrive by the 17th.

If you saw the service on April 26, you know that I went to Montana for a couple of days with my best friend to work on his cabin. We researched all of the states we had to pass through to get to the cabin. Once we were through Illinois (and we did not stop anywhere in Illinois), each state was better than Indiana and progressively got better. We took our own food and used masks and gloves everywhere we had contact. The Montana county we were in did not have any cases of Covid-19. On April 27 Montana opened much of the state. BY the time you read this I will probably be back home. I will definitely be home before Sunday because we want to do the live service again and it is GALE'S BIRTHDAY.

I want to thank everyone for being understanding and baring with us as we try to iron out the bugs of our Facebook Live broadcasts. Some churches around had already invested many dollars into equipment before the pandemic hit and are able to do a more quality broadcast. We are trying every week to improve. We have applied new hardware including a tripod and stand, a camera, a capture card, special wiring, and others. We figured out a way to get sound from our control board. It was compatible with the camera, but the camera's we have tried have not been compatible with the computers. We have tried 4 cameras and 4 computers. We have sought advice from many folks in the technology, hardware, and systems fields. Many things that may help are sold out.

Between myself, and others, we have invested about 30 hours in research and consultations. We could invest a considerable amount of money and have a very good broadcast. However, we have to consider if that is the wisest thing to do considering the pandemic lockdown may be over before we would get it and it may take money away from the building repairs that are so desperately needed. Please be patient with us and thankful for the effort that everyone is putting out in order to get the best broadcast possible. (Prayers would be good too).

Also, I want to remind everyone of how to contact me. First try my cell phone 765-505-2109 by voice call or text. Second try our house 765-344-7707. If that does not work call or text Gale's phone 765-366-2240. My phone is ALWAYS on day or night. I do not ever shut it off. Sometimes I may be out of the coverage area or unavailable due to meetings, running machinery that is noisy, Doc appointment, shower, etc. Leave a message and I will get back to you. If it is an immediate need call one of the other numbers above or text me and state it is an emergency. I have been taking calls 27/7 since 1975 and it does not bother me any time you call for an urgent need. You may also call Kathy during office hours and she will track me down. I am here for you so please make an effort to get me if you need me or you know someone else that needs me.
