



### Unity in Christ Means... Agree in Christ

Philippians 4:1-3 (ESV) "Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved. I entreat Euodia and I entreat Syntyche to agree in the Lord. Yes, I ask you also, true companion, help these women, who have labored side by side with me in the gospel together with Clement and the rest of my fellow workers, whose names are in the book of life."

I've often glanced over the names of the people the Apostle Paul mentions in Philippians 4:1-3. They've seemed arbitrary in the past; as if they didn't matter. I used to think, "Whoa, what did they do to be called out by name? Must've been pretty bad." And then I'd move on to verses in Chapter 4 that are more popular like, "be anxious for nothing..." or "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

I didn't give much thought to the fact that Paul plainly and openly called these women out. Euodia and Syntyche must have been well-known by the Philippian Church. They are noted as leaders and "co-laborers" in the Gospel. What has to happen for two leaders within a Church to be openly rebuked by an overseeing authority?

It's simple, they didn't agree on something. More importantly, that disagreement was causing division between them as God's family and in the greater body of Christ.

Here's what we know based on these three verses. First, the two women are recognized as Christians by Paul. They both believe in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. So we can assume they agree on the essential things of the Christian faith. Next, they are disagreeing on something badly enough that it bears mentioning. Paul feels the need to intervene, so he must be trying to bring healing to a situation that is out of control. Third, Paul's begging them to agree. He profoundly cares for them. He cares for the Church and that the Gospel would be represented well by their unity. He's standing in the gap so that division doesn't win the day.

These facts tell us what is really important in the situation. While we might want to know the juicy details of their disagreement, it's obvious that whatever divides them falls deeply short of what unifies them. So why divide over it?

And that's the lesson.

Think about the magnitude of the division in our country and world right now. Aren't you sick of it? I know I am. Wouldn't you like to talk more about what we agree on rather than what divides us? I know I really do. This national division is blasphemously creeping into Churches. Nevertheless in Christianity, Christ is supreme. Our opinions on issues subordinate to the essentials of faith in Jesus fall far down the list compared to representing the Gospel well and loving one another.

I wonder if Euodia and Syntyche 'buried the hatchet'. Did they heed Paul's plea and see how their differences were hurting themselves, the Church and the mission? Again, we don't know. Maybe, like the lesson, those details are unimportant compared to the fact that this happened then and continues to happen now. The question is when we disagree over subordinate things, will we hear and heed the plea of the Apostle Paul?
