"The Past is history, the Future is mystery. The most important bit is the Present. And why is that? Because it is a PRESENT!!"

Sociologists in the past have told us that 45% of people worry about what has been, 45% of what is to come, and only 10% about the here and now, the present. Viewing the social scene today that analysis may no longer reflect the reality as a great many young people, and not so young, are inclined to say, 'to hell with the past, that's gone and the future can sure take care of itself; let's make hay while the sun shines!' Recent scenes of post-Covid partying probably support that prognosis!

And yet many of us, one hopes and prays, realise that over time there is more to life than just the present. Our knowledge and experience of our past help us to maximise how we live the present moment and so prepare ourselves for the unknowns of the future.

Perhaps the reason Jesus uses Parables to teach is that they encapsulate how important all three time frames are in helping us to live as our God would like us to. A Parable is perhaps the outer covering to the inner meaning of the Past, the Present and the Future. Above all they help us to recognise the image of God in the "Other", no matter how unpalatable the "Other" may be! The crème de la crème of course is that they represent the eternal mystery of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit and believe it or not OURSELVES!

Public Masses It has been so good to welcome people back to Mass this last week. After a long fast it has been a reminder of just how important it is in our lives and for the world. The Sunday obligation continues to be dispensed so please do not feel guilty if you don't feel ready to come back just yet — we will all adjust at our own speed and that's quite appropriate.

- Mass won't be at the usual times, so please check.
- We will continue to observe **2m distancing** of seating rather than 1m+.
- We will **clean the church** after each use.
- We will continue to celebrate Sunday Liturgy at the 10am Saturday Mass, and with Sunday Liturgy of the Word online.
- It's likely that there will be enough space at Weekday Masses if you want to come but you might wish to check.
- St John's, Farncombe we will be resuming Sunday Mass here at 9.00am from 26th July. Due to the slightly later start, Mass at St Joseph's will start at 12 noon (and not 11.30 am) from next Sunday.
- We are using a booking system for weekend Masses, using an online form: https://tinyurl.com/y9qmmk2r You only need fill out the form once as we will use the information you provide to help us allocate places for the coming weeks. However, if your preferences change – e.g. in view of the 9am St John's/12 noon St Joseph's options - please do fill out the form again, or email or phone the parish office.

It is likely that there will be reduced provision of Mass over the **August Bank Holiday** weekend to allow Fr Jonathan to take a break. At present many of our priests who would usually supply are either engaged elsewhere or taking Covid-19 precautions.

Churches are open for private prayer on Sundays (4-5 pm) at St Edmund's and Wednesdays (10-11 am) at St Joseph's. A big thank you to all those who have helped with the stewarding and cleaning.

Sacrament of Penance (Confession) or Anointing of the Sick are available by arrangement with Fr Jonathan. Guidelines have now been issued on Communion for the housebound and we hope to resume this later in the month.

First Holy Communions and Confirmations 2020. Plans are in hand for these celebrations which we hope will take place from September, and we will keep you updated.

First Holy Communion 2021 Registration for this is now open. The form can be found on the website at https://stedsgod.com/fhc. If you have children who wish to make their First Holy Communion this summer or in the coming year, please do try to get back into the habit of coming to Church – even if only to light a candle at first – after our long break. It will help your children and be a source of God's help and grace in these challenging times.
