I'm Pr. D. J. Rasner, and I will be working with you as you prepare for your next pastor. I want to use this article to introduce myself and let you get to know me a bit.

COUNCIL

The church council met on Tuesday, July 14th for its regular monthly meeting.

The Finance committee reported that the funds received through the PPP Loan program have almost been completely dispersed and will be working with First National Bank, the lender, to have the loan forgiven through the program's guidelines. The committee also reported that JoAnn Wedegartner will be joining the committee and Helen Berglund was nominated to be our new Financial Secretary. Helen's nomination was unanimously approved by the council. Thank you to both JoAnn and Helen for their willingness to serve, we are blessed to have you.

The Property committee reported that no responses had been received from the ads placed in local newspapers for roof replacement bids. Due to the corona virus and shut down of projects earlier in the year, contractors are busy catching up and booked out for this year. The Property committee will continue to work to secure bids for replacement of the roof next year. There are no immediate concerns for the existing roof. The committee will also be soliciting bids to make needed repairs to the parsonage garage.

The council discussed the current Sunday service schedule and decided to cancel the 8:00 A.M. service for now, effective August 2nd. With the uncertainty of the oncoming Interim Pastor and other logistical concerns such as musicians and volunteers to run the sound board and screens, it was felt best to end the service for now and revisit it in the future as the need arises.

The council met on Wednesday the 15th with Pastor Jim Duehring, the Assistant to the Bishop, and had an exit interview with Pastor Carr. The discussion was centered around Pastor's time here at First and some of the issues we faced together. We dealt with the separation from Trinity, we faced the closing of our church due to the pandemic, something we all never imagined. We saw growth in our membership and an awareness of a new Pastor in our community. He was the guy you saw wearing the Pastoral collar at many local events or just out, even sparking a call to Telephone Time. We discussed what both the church and Pastor have learned from our time together. We wished the Pastor and his family well in their future and hoped Pastor would receive a positive vote in his next Call, scheduled to be held July 19th. At the time of this writing, we have learned his Call was positive and he will be serving a NALC synod church in Wyoming. Are prayers go with Pastor and his family as they travel the path God has laid out for them.

We prayed with Pastor Carr and he left the meeting.

Pastor Duehring then introduced Pastor DJ Rasner. Pastor Rasner will serve as our Administrative Pastor, providing pastoral care, attending council and other meetings as necessary, help in guiding us forward and presiding over Sunday services or scheduling pulpit supply. This is not a full-time position and council approved the synod suggested compensation package.

As we move forward, we will miss Pastor Carr and his family, however this can be an exciting time at First Lutheran. In Proverbs 17:22 the Bible says: "A joyful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones." May we have a joyful heart.

We will begin by forming a committee to evaluate the needs and wants at First. Any suggestions or ideas will be welcomed and appreciated. Once the committee has finished its work, a Call committee will be formed to start the search for a new full-time pastor.

I ask that we all pray that the Holy Spirit be with us, guide us, and lead us in the direction God has planned for us at First Lutheran.


