## 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time 2nd August 2020

Food events occur quite frequently in Jesus' short three-year ministry. When they do occur, they are very clearly significant as they portray Jesus' underlying message, a message that says: 'I am the source of your sustenance.' The beauty and subtlety of his message however, is that he is not referring to our physical sustenance, important though it might be to the people with him, but to our spiritual sustenance.

The Wedding Feast at Cana was the first such recorded event; and perhaps the final one was not the Last Supper, vitally important though it was, but maybe the Breaking of Bread at the intimate supper he had with the two Disciples he met on the road to Emmaus? This was the very first Mass after his Resurrection, the Mass that tells us that he is the Bread of Life! Fr Dennis Billy C.Ss.R, in his thoughtful book: *Meeting Jesus on the Road to Emmaus*, encapsulates the real meaning of our spiritual sustenance when he describes the Mass and its foundation by Jesus, as an enactment of Banquet, Presence and Suffering. Let us contemplate the possible meaning of these three theological cum spiritual ingredients.

- **Banquet** emphasises 'Community'. We come together, to share, to offer and to participate.
  - **Presence** emphasises the reality of 'Being'; a spiritual faith-filled reality that offers eternal sustenance.
  - **Suffering** emphasises the need to live and be strengthened by its many challenges.
- Food, Love, Eternity, for Thought Indeed!! (Deacon Jeremy)

**Lectio Divina** This is a very special and fruitful way of praying with the Scriptures and takes place online every **Wednesday 7.30pm – 8.30pm** on GoToMeeting.

**August Art Competition** A bit of holiday fun for our younger parishioners with a weekly painting and drawing competition based on the miracles of Jesus. Parents can read the story, then the children can interpret it as they like and use any medium. Each week one picture will be chosen as the outright winner and will get a virtual rosette (and maybe an actual treat from their parents!) There are two age categories: 2-6 years and 7-10 years, and one entry per child. The miracle for this first week is the feeding of the five thousand (Matt 14:15-21). It confirms what would be possible in developing St Joseph's and tentatively raises the question of whether an option of developing St Edmund's should be explored. **Churches are open for private prayer** on Sundays (4-5 pm, often with Exposition) at St Edmund's and Wednesdays (10-11 am) at St Joseph's. A big thank you to all those who help with the stewarding and cleaning.

**Public Masses** Thank you to everyone for your patience during this transition period while we adjust to coming back to Mass. It has been so good to welcome everyone and to appreciate just how important it is in our lives and for the world. The Sunday obligation continues to be dispensed so please do not feel guilty if you aren't ready to come back just yet – we will all adjust at our own speed and that's quite appropriate.

A few points to note:

- **Mass times are changeable, so please check**
- We will continue to celebrate Sunday Liturgy at the 10am Saturday Mass, and with Sunday Liturgy of the Word **online at 10.30am**
- **Face coverings** At the time of writing the government have just announced that face coverings will become mandatory in places of worship from 8th August. We await further details of what this will mean for readers and the presider. Meanwhile, this weekend all those attending Mass are encouraged to wear a face covering to help get used to it.
- We will **clean the church** after each use and continue to observe **2m distancing** of seating rather than 1m+
- We are using a booking system for weekend Masses, using an online form: <https://tinyurl.com/y9qmmk2r> You only need fill out the form once as we will use the information you provide to help us allocate places for the coming weeks. Please also email or phone the parish office with your preferences.

**Being a good neighbour** Please remember to act considerately towards our neighbours. If you notice something that needs taking care of on our property or theirs please speak with the parish office or Fr Jonathan before sorting it out.

There will be reduced provision of Mass over the **August Bank Holiday** weekend to allow Fr Jonathan to take a break.
