# **19th Sunday in Ordinary Time** 9th August 2020

The Gospel this Sunday contains an epiphany: Jesus is revealed as God, and with their little faith the disciples recognise this and worship him.

Jesus comes to the disciples in the fourth watch of the night, probably sometime just before dawn. They have been fighting with headwinds ever since he left them the previous evening. And when Jesus meets them, he reveals his divinity to them saying "It is I" and urges them, as he and the prophets before him so often did, not to be afraid. At the end they do him homage, just as did the magi before the crib.

It is interesting, I think, that all this happens not after the feeding of the multitude but in the fourth watch of the night. Jesus left the disciples the previous evening and spent the night in prayer while they battled against headwinds. They have not despaired as they do on other occasions, but it has clearly been a hard time. It is sometime after 3am, and probably close to the first light of dawn, that he comes to them.

As many people struggle at the moment with what is becoming a long night and find themselves against strong headwinds this Gospel reminds us that Jesus is God. He comes with all the strength and power over things that threaten us of the one who is the Lord of Creation. That this encounter happens only after the disciples have had the experience of a hard night should give us hope and courage. The dawn will come, and when it does our Saviour will be revealed and our hearts will be filled with joy. In the meanwhile, our little faith will be enough, and the Lord will hold us firmly by the hand and pray to his Father on our behalf.

### Sunday Parish Angelus and revised

**Mass times?** It's likely that from 5th September we will adjust our Sunday schedule so that Mass is at say 9.00am & 10.30am, and an online Parish Angelus at noon. The Angelus might include one of the Sunday readings, a song, a thought for the day and some bidding prayers and provide an opportunity to catch up before Sunday lunch with some "prosecco and prayer". Please let Fr Jonathan know this weekend if you have any thoughts on this change.

**Blessing of Students and Teachers** will take place at all Masses on 5th & 6th September. There are many in our parish who work or learn in our schools, colleges and universities. The first weekend in September will be an opportunity for us to celebrate their work and to ask God's blessing on them for the year ahead. If you are a teacher, teaching assistant, tutor or lecturer please let the parish office know if you would like to come to Mass that weekend so that we can ensure you are included.

**Update on Buildings** An email about our parish buildings went out recently and printed copies are available at the back of church. It confirms what would be possible in developing St Joseph's and tentatively raises the question of whether an option of developing St Edmund's should be explored. Fr Jonathan welcomes your feedback and any questions you may have.

*Lectio Divina* This is a special and fruitful way of praying with the Scriptures and takes place online every **Wednesday 7.30pm – 8.30pm** on GoToMeeting.

**Public Masses** Thank you to everyone for your patience during this transition period while we adjust to coming back to Mass. It has been so good to welcome everyone and to appreciate just how important it is in our lives and for the world. The Sunday obligation continues to be dispensed so please do not feel guilty if you aren't ready to come back just yet – we will all adjust at our own speed and that's quite appropriate.

A few points to note:

- Mass times are changeable, so please check
- There is a basket for the **Collection** at the entrance. Thank you for your financial support for the parish.
- We will continue to celebrate Sunday Liturgy at the 10am Saturday Mass, and the Sunday Liturgy of the Word **online at** 10.30am.
- Face coverings should be worn in Church unless legally exempt. Please remember to remove and replace them using the ear loops.
- We will clean the church after each use and continue to observe 2m distancing of seating rather than 1m+
- We are using a booking system for weekend Masses, using an online form: <u>https://tinyurl.com/y9qmmk2r</u> You only need fill out the form once as we will use the information you provide to help us allocate places for the coming weeks. Please also email or phone the parish office with your preferences.

There will be reduced provision of Mass over the **August Bank Holiday** weekend to allow Fr Jonathan to take a break from 23rd August to 4th September. Deacon Jeremy will be available through this time to provide any pastoral support that may be needed and to lead a few Liturgies of the Word and Holy Communion.

Sacrament of Penance (Confession) or Anointing of the Sick are available by arrangement with Fr Jonathan. **First Holy Communion 2021** Registration for this is now open. If you have children who wish to make their First Holy Communion this summer or in the coming year, please do try to get back into the habit of coming to Church – even if only to light a candle at first – after our long break. It will help your children and be a source of God's help and grace in these challenging times.
