Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary 16th August 2020

Mary is the Mother of God, the Mother of Jesus and the first and model disciple of her Son. The feasts of Mary tell us about her Son and about God's working in his son's disciples. The Assumption of Mary (the 'Dormition' in Eastern Churches) is not explicitly mentioned in Scripture, but it is one of the most significant mysteries and ancient traditions. It might therefore seem strange to think that it was only 70 years ago that it was formally defined.

One of my lecturers once observed that rules are a surer indication of their breach than their observance: they only get made when things need correcting. There is a parallel in solemn definitions. Theological boundaries get drawn when something risks getting missed.

In the aftermath of the Second World War it seemed right and fitting for Pope Pius XII to recall that Mary, "led a life troubled by cares, hardships, and sorrows, and that, moreover, what the holy old man Simeon had foretold actually came to pass, that is, that a terribly sharp sword pierced her heart as she stood under the cross of her divine Son, our Redeemer" that the "Mother of God, like her only begotten Son, had actually passed from this life" and "Her sacred body had never been subject to the corruption of the tomb, and the august tabernacle of the Divine Word had never been reduced to dust and ashes."

Perhaps one of the reasons why this mystery became so important for us now is what it tells us about our destiny. Mary was assumed into heaven body and soul on account of her sharing in the life and death of her Son. We will die, but we will be raised to new life – soul *and* body – on account of our sharing, through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, in the life and death of the Son of Mary. It is the *whole* of us that will be given new life in heaven. We rejoice today that God's promise to Abraham and his descendants has indeed been fulfilled in Mary, and that it will most surely be fulfilled in us too when God's saving work is completed.
