Labor Day, the 1st Monday in September, is a creation of the 'labor' movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers. It constitutes a yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country.



Patriot Day is not a federal holiday; schools and businesses remain open in observance of the occasion, although memorial ceremonies for the 2,977 victims are

often held. (excluding the 19 hijackers who also perished)

Grandparents Day goes back to 1956 when a mother, Marian McQuade helped organize a community celebration for those over 80 in nursing homes who had been forgotten by their families. She then shifted efforts to the national level achieving success in 1978. Ideas for Grandparents Day: a) a simple meal and time to visit; b) Share family stories and look at old family pictures; c) Board games, card games, puzzles; d) Outings like museums, etc.



CONSTITUTION DAY September 17, 1787, the Founding Fathers signed the U.S. Constitution. For the past 225 years, the Constitution

has served as the supreme law of the land. The Constitution, the Bill of Rights and other amendments, define our government and guarantee our rights. We also recognize people who are taking steps to become U.S. citizens and help them prepare.



National POW/MIA Recognition Day is an observance that honors who were prisoners of war as well as those who are still missing in action. The remains of almost 82,000 Americans are still missing

In 2020, the autumnal equinox—also called the of a September equinox or fall equinox—arrives on Tuesday, September 22. Fall begins in the Northern Hemisphere and spring begins in the Southern Hemisphere. During the equinox, the Sun crosses what we call the "celestial equator"—an imaginary extension into space of Earth's equator line. The equinox occurs precisely when the Sun's center passes through this line. When the Sun crosses the equator from north to south, this marks the autumnal equinox: when it crosses from south to north, this marks the vernal equinox.
