## The Visitor

Dear Friends of Atonement,

Autumn brings a return to school in different forms this year and the resumption of a fuller schedule of congregational activities even though most of them are still virtual. We also have the addition—worshipping outside in the parking lot. It's an opportune time to wonder where we stand before God. What is it that God wants from us? How can we be shaped again and again by God's word in our worshiping assemblies? What is this life with God that Jesus came to bring?

As fall rhythms return to a normal rhythm, we generally have backpack blessing. What if this year, we looked at the blessing or affirmation of Christian Vocation? Yes, it is in our red hymnal (pg 84 if you are interested). In it, we get the question "Will you endeavor to pattern your life on the Lord Jesus Christ . . . all the days of your life?" (p. 84).

What does it mean to pattern our life on the Lord Jesus Christ? This fall, we will see in the Gospel, Jesus tells a series of parables to describe this life with God that in Matthew is called "the kingdom of heaven." In Jesus' parables we find that mercy meets justice head on. In one parable, a king is the model of unexpected forgiveness for a great debt (Lectionary 24, September 13). In another, a landowner hiring day laborers pays the same wage to all, no matter what time of day they began their work (Lectionary 25, September 20). And in yet another, a king extends a wedding invitation to those in the streets when others more likely to respond reject the initial invitation (Lectionary 28, October 11). Jesus' stories surprise his listeners, causing them to rethink their place. How does it cause us to rethink our place?

So if we look at this via the classic Lutheran concept of law and gospel, how do we deal with these texts? The law- we find ourselves tangled in a web of judgment and cannot make our way out. We feel convicted. The Gospel- we recognize that Christ's death and resurrection, his teaching, and his pattern of life break open the ways of God's mercy and forgiveness to those who need it (which is all of us).

Mercy might be the joyful refrain for our communal lives with God. We can laugh at Jonah, and at ourselves, as we say along with the reluctant prophet, "I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and ready to relent from punishing" (Jonah 4:2; Lectionary 25, September 20). Can we imagine a church named "The Church of Second Chances" (or third, fourth, fifth, sixth, or seventh)? Are there stories you can tell or invite others to tell about starting over that might be connected to renewal of our ministries? In those stories, and in the readings that shape this season, we can come to realize that the adage "The church is a hospital for sinners, not a museum for saints" is just right for us! The true query becomes how we use this information to change us.

Corey called the meeting called to order at 7:00pm. Jarred began the meeting with a prayer.

Approval of June 18, 2020 minutes: Jarred motioned to approve. Leah seconded. Motion carried.

Committee reports were sent electronically to the council. The following items were discussed:

- FORE planning a bible study. Contact Jean Keim or Pastor Brenda if interested in joining this.
- Christian Ed Still working on plans for classes this fall, will likely follow GB public schools' plan.
- Youth/Family no report
- Properties Major water leak was found in the large group room (Herbie's Café), due to a pipe bursting. It will be treated tomorrow. Discussing whether to get insurance involved. Jarred will follow up with Gene on this.
  - Technology subcommittee: Corey is addressing minor issues as they arise.
  - Worship & Music no meeting in the last month. Viewership of online services is down as well as in-person service attendance. Pastor noted that the peak viewing times are around 7am or 8pm.
  - MPS no meeting in the last month
  - United 2 Serve U2S plans to add a video to the online service video for one week of each month. The first one will be the July 26. Looking into a virtual Chicken Dinner/Fundraiser. Distributions requested are: \$250 for UWGB Campus Cupboard. Denise motioned to approve. Jarred seconded. Motion carried.
- Jarred made a motion to approve all committee reports. Leah seconded. Motion carried.

#### **Pastor's Report**

Pastor Brenda is working to figure out why viewership of online services is down. The check-in feature of ICON (our new membership software) is being used to track attendance at in-person services. Pastor presided over a wedding on July 11. At-home VBS is now is progress. Marilyn made a motion to approve Pastor's report. Denise seconded. Motion carried.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

In Julie's absence, Denise reviewed the financial reports for June. June's revenues were even with budget but expenses were underbudget significantly, leaving a net income of \$5,500 for June. Year-to-date revenues and expenses are both underbudget, leaving a net loss of \$887. We are doing better than budget, which expected a \$2,300 loss through June. One CD comes due at end of July so MPS is discussing whether to reinvest or take out some of the cash. Julie is working to add a brief financial report in each weekly Moment of Atonement email to keep the members updated on the church's financial situation.

Denise asked for approval on our quarterly Crossways (\$212.50) and LSS (\$125) donations that are in the budget. Jarred made a motion to approve these donations. Marilyn seconded. Motion carried.

Marilyn made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. Jarred seconded. Motion carried.

#### **Old Business**

Pastor left the Zoom meeting and the Council entered a closed session.

Jarred ended the meeting with a prayer.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:10pm.



- 5. Roll the strand into a ball and crochet or knit as you would with yarn.


