## Church Without Church?

Without any doubt, churches everywhere are trying to figure out how to be church when social distancing is in the best interest of everyone's health. First Lutheran is no exception. Unlike most of the churches in Iron River, First has chosen to limit indoor worship once again, and rely solely on the radio and Facebook broadcasts as the primary way to worship God. Absolutely, this is less than ideal. Every one of us, myself included, would rather be in the building, worshiping together in the presence of our church family.

I would rather be able to see you in person, to look you directly into your eyes and extend the hand of peace as we share community together. I would rather greet you in person in the name of Jesus, who binds us together in one body. I would rather join with you in one chorus as we sing of God's greatness, love, mercy, and kindness. I would rather experience God's Word seeping deep into the core of our humanness, and to experience that with you. I would rather share in the Body and Blood of Christ with you . . . without having to even think about germs and aerosols and viruses.

#### What is Church?

We have a unique opportunity right now to really get back to the heart of what the church really is. I am definitely aware of the need that many of you have to be in the building. There is something different about that space that has a grounding affect on us. It is almost as if we step into another realm, another dimension of reality, when we walk through the doors of the church building. We have the potential to experience the peace of God there, to leave the cares and worries of our lives behind for a moment, to be validated for who we are as humans beings struggling to understand life and all of its complexities.

However, it is critical that we all understand that the building <u>is not</u> the same as the church, and I think we are trying to figure that out right now. The church building is simply a building, a structure, with brick and mortar and wires and pipes, but it is not the church.

Instead, the Church is the body of Christ—it is the fellowship of Jesus' disciples wherever they are located. The Church consists not of building materials but flesh and blood. The Church is the people; the Church is you! Whenever Jesus' followers gather, there is the Church, and there is Jesus among them. Right now, for many of us, the "Church" is gathering in our homes.

First Lutheran Church, you might not be able to gather in your church building right now, but that does not mean that you have ceased to be the Church! You are still the Church. You are still followers of Christ. You are still representatives of Jesus wherever you are. You still carry the peace of God with you. You still live complicated lives, but you do so as people of faith who trust God and the Christ that God raised from the dead.

The day will come when we can gather again in community. The day will come when the doors will be unlocked and the sanctuary will be open. That day will come. Until then, First Lutheran Church might be different from the community of Iron River. But, we do so because we are deeply concerned about the health and well-being of this community of faith, and that is our priority. Until it is safe for us to gather in your space together, I pray God's overwhelming peace to be upon you.



At the August Council meeting, we welcomed Pr. D.J. Rasner as our Interim Administrator. Pr. D.J. is getting to know us as we are getting to know him. He is in the process of going through the church and parsonage and will be making suggestions as to what items he feels need to be addressed. There is a lot of "stuff" that needs to be taken care of or gotten rid of. There are upwards of 20 pastoral vacancies within the Synod. It, therefore, will take a while for us to receive a candidate as we are at the bottom of the list. The first step will be to update our profile and submit it to the Synod. A Call Committee will then be established when we reach that point.

Regarding in-house services, it was decided to watch the county numbers in August and September, after the students have been in school for a month. We will hold a Council meeting September 29<sup>th</sup> to decide if it will be safe to re-open on October 4<sup>th</sup>. Council felt this would be better than see-sawing from open to closed during this time period. Next month's council meeting will address a plan to have in place in case the pastor should become ill.

We have experienced some difficulties in broadcasting on Sundays. We hope to resolve these issues as quickly as possible. We will check with other area churches for suggestions of what we can do to make the broadcasting more reliable.

The financial report stated our expenses exceeded our income by \$3,974. Income deficit from this point last year is \$1,785, and \$276 has been received from "other" income. The PPP loan has been fully expensed. First National Bank will contact us once they receive loan forgiveness instructions.

The Property Committee reported we are awaiting an estimate of how many shingles will be required to redo the roof. They will then suggest a fundraiser to help fund this project. It is felt the parsonage garage door can be repaired in-house, along with other structure issues. The parsonage walk-thru resulted in the need to replace the dishwasher and microwave. Painting is needed as well as a thorough cleaning. WELCA has volunteered to do the cleaning. Two convection ovens have been obtained from the school. (Thank you, Tom!) This will eventually allow us to conduct pasty sales within the church.

The Christian Education program will possibly resume in October, after school has been in session. It is possible an on-line program can be developed. A list of student names and ages will be prepared and parents will be contacted for additional input regarding the program.

The September council meeting will be held September 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m.


