Text: Galatians 3:10-14

Title: Christ Died the Accursed Death of the Cross

Introduction

Why did Jesus Christ die in the horrible, shameful way of crucifixion?

- I. Because Christ was condemned by Pontius Pilate to be executed by crucifixion.
- II. Because the Lord Jesus Christ must face and experience death in all its terror, desolation, and suffering.
- III. Because the Lord Jesus Christ died the death of crucifixion as a death of atonement and propitiation.
- IV. Because the Lord Jesus Christ died the accursed death of the cross.
